2021 Nursing Annual Giving Campaign Request for Proposal

PURPOSE AND OVERVIEW

The mission of the USF College of Nursing is to provide innovation and leadership in preparing 21st-century nurses to demonstrate excellence in research, education, and clinical care while promoting health and wellness in our community and around the world. To that end, the USF College of Nursing cultivates nurse leaders, supports nursing research, and disseminates new models of care that are critical to preparing the next generation of health care leaders.

Leaders in Care is a campaign that supports our nursing students by enhancing their education through a faculty-led project that is selected annually. Through this campaign, faculty, staff, alumni and friends of the College of Nursing are given the opportunity to make a financial investment to fund the selected project each year. This program is exclusive to faculty-proposed initiatives that will promote nursing-driven innovation and directly impact the students of the College of Nursing. Submission examples include but are not limited to products, programs, and opportunities that enhance the student experience of our Bull Nurses.

PROPOSAL PERIOD

This campaign application will open on Monday, July 27, and close on Monday, August 24. Fundraising will begin on October 1 and close on December 31.

GRANT AMOUNT

The College of Nursing will award funding to a faculty-led, student-centric project totaling up to \$35,000. Funding is provided through donations to the Leaders in Care Campaign including our match donation this year of \$15,000 by alumna Janet Fansler MSN '88 and her husband, Richard MED '00.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Principal investigators must be current USF College of Nursing faculty members and at least one co-investigator (instructor, assistant, associate professor) must be full-time. Proposals must demonstrate how the grant funding will directly impact students of the USF College of Nursing.

Disclaimer: From year to year the selection committee will prioritize submissions focusing on new or different academic areas or communities.

PROPOSAL APPLICATION

Proposals should not exceed five pages in length (not including CVs, vice dean letter of support, biographical sketches, budget and timeline). Proposals should identify what the funding will be used for, why it is needed, who will be impacted, and how it will benefit students at the College of Nursing and the USF Health community. All proposals *must* include a letter of support from a Vice Dean approving their submission. Additional materials may be requested. **All proposals must be submitted electronically via email to nursealum@usf.edu by 11:59 p.m. on Monday, August 24.**
