

Animal Information

What is a Premise ID?

If you are planning to show livestock (excluding rabbits, cats, dogs, and horses), it is important that you obtain a premise ID number from the Indiana State Board of Animal Health (BOAH). A Premise ID is a unique number assigned to the place where your animals are kept. This is part of the national animal traceability program, and allows for tracking and movement of animals. This is important for animal health and safety. You will have to have this information with you when you ID your animal for the 4-H program. Premise ID numbers are free, and easy to get. You can obtain yours by visiting BOAH's website at www.in.gov/boah or by calling 877-747-3038

What is 4HOnline?

4HOnline is our web-based data management system. This is where you sign up information, projects and Animal ID information. This allows the Purdue Extension office and 4-H Club leaders to generate reports and other items that they need to inform you of events, and project information. You as a 4-H family can read our newsletters, update your contact information and sign up for events using the 4HOnline system. It is important if you move, or change a phone number or email address that you update that information in your family profile. To access this website go to <https://in.4honline.com>

What is FairEntry?

FairEntry is our data management system for items related to the fair. This system is where classes are selected, auction information is generated, and show programs are managed. All 4-H Livestock members will need to log into this system using their 4HOnline profile to place their animals into their proper classes, sign up for showmanship and other club events. It is important that you complete this information when you receive the instructions at the end of May.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

YQCA is a great learning program that all 4-H members that are involved in: Beef, Dairy Feeder, Dairy, Lamb, Swine, Goat, Poultry and Rabbit projects need to complete each year. This program will allow the youth to learn more about:

*Their role in food animal production
*Animal Care

*Food Safety
*How to use the life skills members learn from their projects.

This program is nationally recognized and has the support of many of the national breed and commodity organizations. There are two ways that a 4-H member can complete this requirement, via online or an instructor led session. Both sessions do require you to be signed up on: <http://yqca.org> Please be sure to use your 4HOnline log in information to sign up to insure your information gets into our database. The online version is \$12.00 and the instructor led version is \$3.00 and is paid during online registration.

The requirement will need to be completed by **May 15, 2020** in order to be able to show at the Elkhart County 4-H Fair.

Animal Identification

Identification is an important part of your animal project. This will assist in making sure that you keep good records, and know which animal is which. Below is the identification methods that are used by the 4-H program. This is the information that you will need to enter into the 4HOnline system, please check the club deadlines on the next page and verify with your club leaders if you have questions.

Animal Science Programming

Dairy Foods Team

Do you have an interest in learning more about food science, dairy products, or tasting food? Then the dairy foods team is for you. This program is open to any 4-H member in 3rd - 12th grade, and you don't have to be in a livestock club to join! Participants learn more about dairy products, cheese, milk quality, and marketing. All of our practices are hands on and interactive. The team will start their practices in August 2020. Be on the look out for more information.



Jr. Livestock Advisory Board Building Teen Leaders

This program is open to all 9th - 12th grade 4-H members who are nominated and selected on their leadership capacity, and willingness to learn more about animal science. Members also need to be enrolled in a livestock club. This group focuses on building leadership skills, developing presentations to engage younger 4-H members at countywide events.

Animal Science Day Camp

This program is geared towards any 3rd - 6th grade youth. You do not have to be a 4-H member to participate in this hands on experience. This one day workshop will offer you an up close and personal view of animal parts, hands on science and learning more about animal body systems. The Animal Science day camp will be held in June 2020.



Animal Science Programing

4-H Academy @ Purdue

Geared towards 9th - 12th grade 4-H members, this program at Purdue University is your chance to learn first hand from campus professors, graduate students and staff in a hands on atmosphere! 4-H Academy has workshops based on: Animal Science, Aviation, Engineering, Computers, Health Careers, Nutrition and much more. 4-H members will get to network with over 400 other youth from across the state and have a 3-day experience on a Big Ten Campus! This year 4-H Academy will take place in June. Registration forms are due to the Extension Office on May 1, 2020.



Indiana 4-H Dairy Youth Academy

The Indiana 4-H Dairy Youth Academy is for youth who have an interest in the dairy industry and are going to be in grades 10th - 12th in the 2020 school year. This is a year long program where youth gain hands on knowledge of the dairy industry, dive into their leadership journey and network with industry professionals. Youth will participate in the National Dairy Conference, leadership weekends, an international dairy experience, and an Indiana dairy tour. Information on this program will be released during the spring and applications will be taken until August 2020 for the 2020-2021 class.
