ACTIVE SHOOTER INCIDENT MANAGEMENT (BASIC)

This is an introductory 8-hour performance level direct delivery course designed to improve incident management and integration of law enforcement, fire and EMS responders for active shooter events. The course provides a model framework for use by law enforcement, fire and EMS to manage active shooter event response to improve time to threat neutralization, medical intervention, and survivability of casualties.


- Standard Response Protocol

- Supervisory and Command level personnel from police, fire, EMS and EMA

This course is focused on **Incident Management**.

While tactics may be discussed amongst participants, these courses focus on the Command, Coordination, Communication and Resource Management needed to manage an Active Shooter Incident.



Highly interactive tabletop exercises are utilized to engage and immerse all students in the learning process. Site maps, poker chips that represent people, positions and vehicles, are randomized by dice rolls to add realism to the learning process.
