

The Georgetown County Library System is “near normal.” The mask ordinance is revoked. The front doors are open and unmanned. Restrictions on the number using the library are lifted. Internet and WiFi access has been restored. Faxing, copying, and access to books for all ages are available at all branches now. Auditoriums and meeting rooms are reopened for socially distanced meetings. You can make reservations by filling out the form for the branch you are interested in.

SC CARES typically provided sanctuary to nearly 200 animals at a given time, and Hedrick recounts the most compelling and heartwarming of these wonderful rescues. For animal lovers of all ages, this video series is a must-see.



**Noon-4:30 PM – Sankofa: 14<sup>th</sup> Annual African American Fiber Arts**

Exhibition opens at Brookgreen Gardens. Curated by Torreah “Cookie” Washington, this unique opportunity offers African American fiber artists a showcase to exhibit their original and innovative designs around a changing theme each year. This annual juried exhibit showcases works in fiber created by African American artists from throughout the US. The 14th installment of this traveling exhibition features fiber art pieces from 23 artists who were challenged to create a pictorial fiber artwork interpreting the Adinkra symbol of Sankofa, and its associated proverb to “reach back and get it”. The Sankofa images are a reminder to use the wisdom of the past to aid one in the present moment. Sankofa symbols have a fascinating origin from the Akan tribe of Ghana and are usually depicted as a bird turning its head to place an egg on its back, or as an ornate heart-shape design. The artists were asked to include one Sankofa in each artwork. There are 27 pieces of art in the exhibit, 3 dolls and 24 quilts/wall hangings, from the 23 artists. Exhibiting artists include Aisha Lumumba, Carolyn
