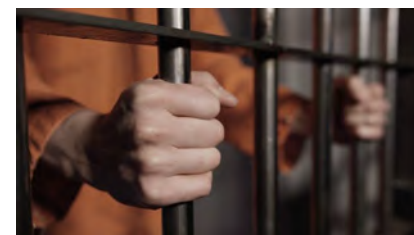

Social Justice



The **Church and Society Ministry Team** hosts civic academies about important issues in our community and works with VIP — **Valley Interfaith Project** — and other faith communities to encourage civic engagement. The last event, a Civic Academy on **Tuesday, October 10**, was led by ASU professor Jesenia Pizarro, and looked at "Offender Rehabilitation." VIP's Human Development Agenda includes criminal justice reform, as well as public education, healthcare, work force training, neighborhood safety, immigration reform and refugee resettlement. The group takes political actions to advance the agenda. Journeys leaders have an opportunity to lead an Advent study on one of two books recommended by the clergy:

- 1) *Journey to the Manger: Exploring the Birth of Jesus*. Cost: \$15; Author: Paula Gooder
- 2) *Because of Bethlehem*. Cost: \$11; Author: Max Lucado.

Journey to the Manger explores the New Testament's various accounts of the birth of Jesus. Learn about the Old Testament prophecies, Jesus' genealogy, the angelic announcements, and what Jesus' birth meant for the powerful and the poor alike.
Note: No study guide or DVD.

Max Lucado's book includes a leader's guide and a class DVD. This study focuses on Jesus' humanity and the promise that God is always near. *Because of Bethlehem* reminds us that "everything works together for the good of those who love God" (Romans 8:28).
