Breaking Free by JP Coughlin

The word “stewardship” is floating around the church a lot these days. We hear it from our pastors in the pulpit, see it written in the *Desert Scroll* newsletter, and it’s here in our bulletin. For many people, it means it’s that time of year where the church asks for money to set the budget, and the faithful open their purses or wallets. Stewardship has become a synonym for giving.

However, stewardship has little to do with giving money to the church. By definition, a steward is simply someone who manages another person’s money or property. The mistake we make, as Christians, is that we assume that our wealth is ours.

God owns it all: the cattle on the hills, and the hills themselves. God doesn’t need our money, because it’s not ours

to begin with. We are only asked to manage God’s gifts, as stewards.

Proverbs 3:9 asks us to “Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the first fruits of everything you produce.” God claims the first fruits of everything. They belong to God. When we apply the principle of First Fruits or First Things First in our lives, we begin to see that all firsts should be given to the Lord: the first part of the day, the first day of the week, and the first of our income.

Pledging is a promise to reserve God’s first fruits. As stewards, we promise to reserve the best of the harvest to support God’s work. Each time we give, each time we understand that we’re not the owner of these things, we move along the spectrum from selfish to selfless.

This is the paradigm shift. This is how we break free.

We offer two traditional services and one alternative service:

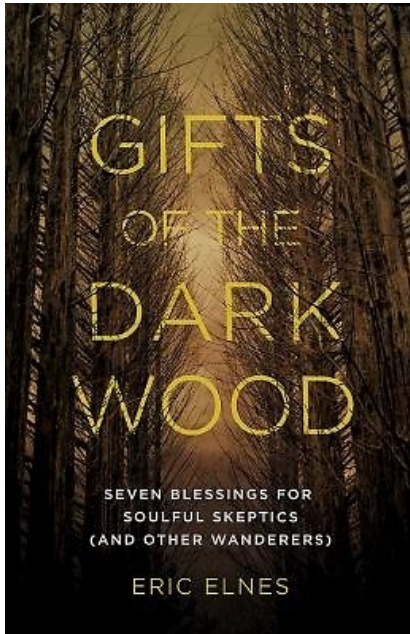
- 8 am in the chapel

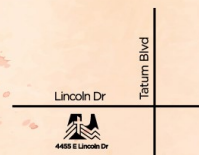


Dueling Divas: Americana

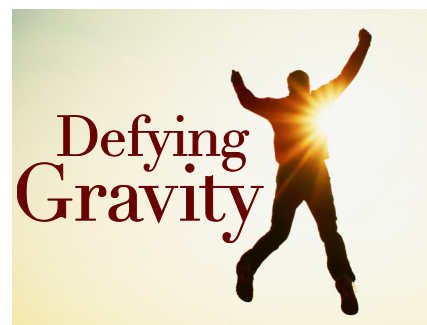
