Mingus Celebrates 70 Years

On July 4th, 130 people traveled to Mingus Camp and Retreat Center to celebrate 70 years of camping ministries. Jack Shaffer served as Mingus Site Committee Chair and Master of Ceremonies for the Anniversary Dedication service. The weekend celebration included opportunities to fish, try out the zip line, and visit the archery range. PVUMC member Clint Miller brought his desert animals and reptiles for a discovery education session and Papa Jon Hearn, who received a volunteer award, led a craft time. The Rev. Ron Bartlow of Trinity United Methodist Church in Flagstaff gave the message at the service, and Shaffer presented awards to many who have made Mingus such a special place. An "All American" picnic prepared by the camp chefs and staff, including site directors Mike and Barbara Crevelt, followed the ceremony, which was attended by previous directors and staff. The day ended with a bus trip to see the Cottonwood Fireworks and s'mores by the campfire. More than \$11,000 was raised to start the Camp Mingus Endowment Fund and raise funds to build a new dining hall. 
PVUMC Preschool Begins New Year

PVUMC Preschool begins its 2017-2018 year with a parent orientation on **Monday, August 14**. As I think about the 2017-2018 preschool year, I feel like it's a good time in our accreditation journey to focus on making improvements to our teaching curriculum and the learning opportunities offered in our classrooms and outdoor play environments.

I have been reading and researching information on STEM — Science, Technology, Engineering and Math — in the early childhood setting. Preschoolers spontaneously engage in STEM activities on a regular basis, and we already offer several STEM experiences in our classrooms, but with a little more intentional guidance, we can further enhance children's opportunities to engage in STEM learning and their development of critical thinking and problem-solving skills. From Paradise

All of us have made journeys. Do you recall a favorite journey? Maybe you took a trip that was exciting, filled with discovery, wonder or joy. Maybe you took more of a metaphorical or developmental journey where you found independence, became a professional, or deepened your faith. Some journeys are life changing. On **Sunday, September 10**, we'll unveil *Journeys*, a new small groups program at PVUMC. I invite each and every one of you to choose an itinerary, find some traveling companions and journey together. It will be new and exciting; it will allow you to grow spiritually. It will be an adventure!

When we take a journey of faith, we can explore, discover and connect with others. God works in us and transforms our faith, deepening our spiritual understanding as we learn to trust God more. As we journey with others, we make friends and learn to lean on each other. God longs for us to travel together.

We weren't made to stand still. Biblical characters provide examples of this, such as Abraham, who God called to leave home and venture to a new land. Later, Moses led the Israelites on a journey that lasted 40 years. But when they arrived in the Promised Land, they understood why they had to go so far. Mary and Joseph and Paul all made journeys of faith, and they rarely walked those roads alone. Jesus took the ultimate journey to the cross, but along the way, he traveled with his disciples and taught them to seek out brothers and sisters to travel with them. Every one of us is on a journey which ultimately takes us to our final and eternal home, but Jesus asks us to follow him NOW, to be his disciples, to learn from him. It is my heartfelt desire that everyone in our church walk more intentionally with Jesus, who shows us the way.

On July 1, our pastoral staff and respective responsibilities changed. Rev. Andrea Andress and Rev. Brenda Smith are both full-time Deacons, with Pastor Brenda working as Director of Family Ministry, overseeing children's ministry programming as well as youth and young adults. She also works with the Fellowship Ministry Team, Open Table and emerging Disabilities Ministry. Pastor Andrea is Director of Spiritual Formation and Discipleship, assisting me in worship, and working with the newly combined Adult Learning/Transformational Living teams, Missions, Change the World Day, and Caring Ministries. She will also coordinate the *Journeys* small groups and oversee the new All-Embracing (formerly Reconciling) Ministry Team.

As Senior Pastor, I will continue to preach, lead our staff and clergy, and take on more responsibility for planning and coordinating the Ignite service. All of us will do visitations, weddings and funerals. This is a season of change at PVUMC, and I invite you to hold the church in prayer as we journey where God leads.
