Message from the President

Over the past few months I have had the opportunity to visit with numerous members of the Chamber. One discussion that I have frequently is regarding the misunderstanding on the structure of the Chamber of Commerce, Tour Tahlequah and the Tahlequah Main Street Association (TMSA). Many believe that Tour Tahlequah is a separate organization and that TMSA is part of the Chamber. So I thought I would take a few minutes to explain.

TMSA is a separate organization that rents office space from the Chamber of Commerce.

TMSA is a 501©3 nonprofit organization that is a member of the National Main Street and a part of the Main Street America network. The organization is governed by their own board of directors who are passionate and dedicated individuals who work to make change in the downtown district by catalyzing reinvestment, creating jobs and fostering pride. Jamie Hale, the new Executive Director, handles the day to day operations of the organization and is focused on creating new and exciting programs and events to enhance the objectives of TMSA.

Tahlequah Main Street Association, Inc. (TMSA) mission is commitment to preserving the rich culture of Tahlequah and supporting downtown business while promoting the opportunity to live, work and play in Tahlequah. The organization works strengthen the community by hosting events to attract residents and visitors to shop, dine and do busi-

ness in the downtown district, such as, Movies in the Park, Wines of Winter, Ladies Night Out and the Annual Red Fern Festival.

Tour Tahlequah is a division of the Tahlequah Area Chamber of Commerce.

Tour Tahlequah is simply the name of the division that promotes Tahlequah as visitor destination. The tourism division is funded through the Hotel Tax that is collected through the City of Tahlequah. The Chamber governs the objectives and funding for the tourism program, as

well as, manages the tourism staff. In order to create a strong program, Gena McPhail, Tourism Director, coordinates programming and promotions through a committee appointed by the Chamber Board called the Tourism Council.

The Tahlequah Area Chamber of Commerce is an organization of business and individuals seeking to advance our community.

Our mission is to:

- *Build our community to attract new residents, visitors, investors and businesses*
- *Promote Tahlequah to new residents, visitors, investors and businesses*

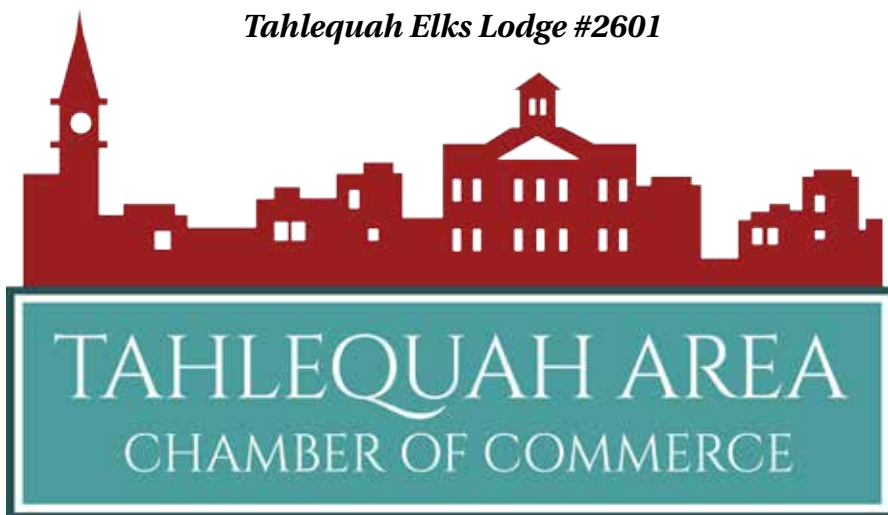

CHAMBER SEEKS MEMBERS TO APPLY TO SERVE ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Tahlequah Area Chamber of Commerce is seeking applicants to serve as a Board of Director member. Three seats are open for a 3-year term from July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2022. An applicant must be a Chamber member in good standing as a member investor and engaged in the Chamber and its activities.

Chamber governance and policy is vested with the Board of Directors, which shall control its property, be responsible for its finances and direct its affairs. The board of directors are responsible for the following:

New directors will be seated on the board beginning July 1, 2019.

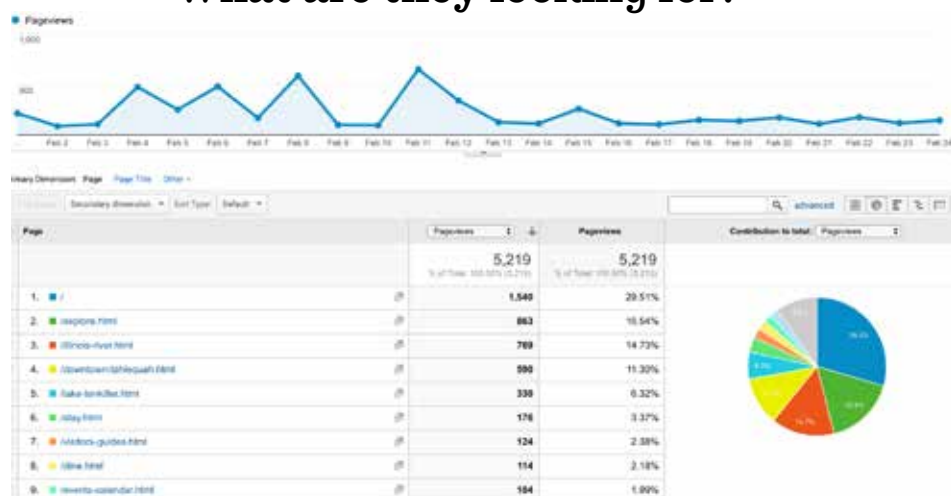
