



More Than Autumn Biscotti Holder

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Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

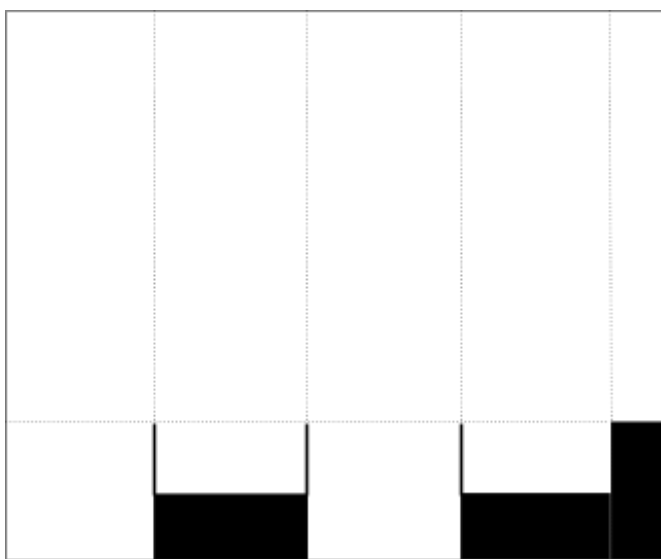
- Bundle: More Than Autumn (164076)
- Cardstock: Cherry Cobbler (119685), Basic White (159276)
- Ink: Memento Tuxedo Black (132708)
- Stampin' Blends Markers: Bubble Bath Combo Pack (161675), Cherry Cobbler Combo Pack (154880), Medium Light Combo

Pack (159463), Pecan Pie Combo Pack (161674), Color Lifter (144608)

- Accessories: Iconic Celebrations Designer Series Paper (164193)
- Tools: Stylish Shapes Dies (159183), Paper Trimmer (152392), Paper Snips (103579), Bone Folder (102300)
- Miscellaneous: Multipurpose Liquid Glue (110755), Mini Stampin' Dimensionals (144108), Tear & Tape (154031), (packaged biscotti)

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. For each biscotti holder, cut a 5-1/2" x 6-1/2" piece of Cherry Cobbler cardstock. Score on the 6-1/2" side at 1-1/2", 3", 4-1/2" and 6". Score on the 5-1/2" side at 4". Use the Paper Trimmer or Paper Snips to cut up to the score line as shown. Use the Paper Trimmer to cut off 5/8" from the 2nd and 4th flaps (see diagram.)



2. Fold in along all score lines and burnish folds with a Bone Folder. Apply Tear & Tape to the 1/2" side flap. Adhere to the first flap, creating a box shape (do not adhere the bottom flaps closed yet.)

3. Cut 4 strips of DSP, each measuring 1-1/4" x 3-3/4". Adhere to the four sides of the box using Multipurpose Liquid Glue.

4. Stamp cups, whipped cream, hearts, candy cane and gingerbread man on scraps of Basic White cardstock with Memento ink. Allow to dry completely, then color with Stampin' Blends Markers. Die-cut using the More Than Autumn Dies. Adhere the whipped cream, candy cane and

gingerbread man together as shown using Multipurpose Liquid Glue. (Trim the bottom of the gingerbread man with Paper Snips to make it look like he's tucked into the whipped cream.) Adhere the hearts to the front of the cups with Mini Stampin' Dimensionals. Set aside.



5. Use the smallest circle die to cut circles from scraps of Basic White cardstock. You will need two circles for each box. Fold the circles in half. Apply Multipurpose Liquid Glue to half of each circle and adhere to the box as shown. The fold in each circle will align with the score line of the box. Keep the circles folded in half and apply glue to the exposed "tab" of each circle. Gently place a stamped and die-cut cup onto the circle "tabs"; press to adhere.



6. Apply Tear & Tape to the bottom flaps to create the bottom of the box. At this point, you can leave the paper backing on the Tear & Tape and safely store your project until you are ready to gift it or display it. (This

project is GREAT for craft fairs because you can store it flat, then assemble when you're ready!)

7. To assemble, remove the paper backing from the Tear & Tape and fold the flaps in to create the box. Tuck the biscotti into the top of the box. I used Gingerbread and Dark Chocolate Peppermint Biscotti to match my themes!
