





COMMODORE'S/PAST COMMODORE'S DINNER DANCE

This year's salute to the Commodores and Past Commodores has just occurred. A little history of the event might be interesting. As early as 1934 the schedule included a "Commodore's Ball". It continues today, but for many years has added a toast to the Past Commodores as well.

Early on and up until a few years ago the dress was formal. The Commodores wore

their dress uniform jackets, male guests in tuxes or white dinner jackets and the ladies in gowns. The event was so popular that it was "Members Only" until sometime in the 90's. It must be noted that until 1976 the club was not air conditioned and hopefully the "sea breezes" came through the open windows.

Starting in the 60's and through the 1990's there was an additional formal dance known as "Christmas in August". The club was decorated in holiday décor and there was a live decorated tree along with Santa. For many of those years, guests brought gifts that were donated to "Toys for Tots". Until 1999, when the club hosted the first New Year's Eve celebration, there was a mid-winter reunion in Philadelphia at a club or hotel which also was formal attire.



The menu for the ball in 1984 was: Open bar for an hour with hors d'oeuvres, shrimp cocktail, Caesar salad, beef wellington, scalloped potatoes, green beans and strawberry shortcake for dessert. The cost was \$60.00 a couple. How times have changed!
