They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, ¹⁴for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. ¹⁵If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Are you new to St Augustine's and curious about where our traditions come from? Have you been here a while, but have questions you've never really gone through about how some things fit together in the Episcopal Church? Do you have questions about the sacrament of Confirmation?

Elaine Randall Book Club – August

In August, the Elaine Randall Book Club is reading *Mrs. Sherlock Holmes* by Brad Ricca. The True Story of the first female US District Attorney who focused on solving cases no one else wanted and advocating innocents. One of her greatest accomplishments was solving the cold case of a missing 18-year-old girl, Ruth Cruger. In the process, she changed how the country viewed the problem of missing girls.

crime stories. But the great mystery of this book - and its haunting twist ending - is how one woman became so famous only to disappear.

The EfM program is preparation for the ministry to which we are all called. It is that vocation for which we pray at the end of the Eucharist: "And now, Father, send us out to do the work you have given us to do, to love and serve you as faithful witnesses of Christ our Lord."

Education of Ministry is sponsored by The University of the South encompassing four years of study with group meetings for thirty-six weeks of the year. Year One studies the Old Testament, Year Two the New Testament, Year Three the history of Christianity and Year Four a survey of Theology. The process of theological reflection which is designed to help participants see the world and their lives through a theological perspective is introduced and practiced. The group, which meets for two to three hours, is composed of
