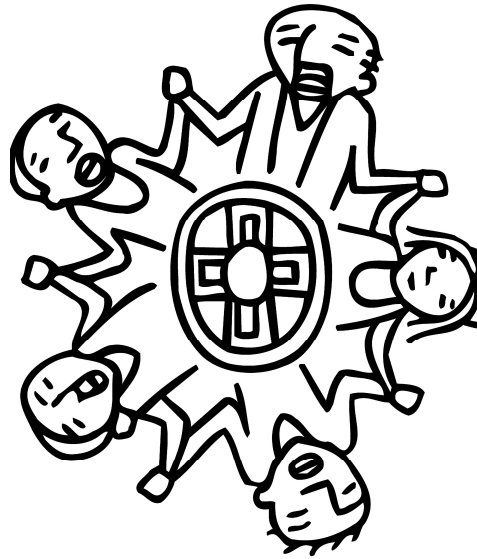

¹³ Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? ¹⁴ But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, ¹⁵ but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you, ¹⁶ yet do it with gentleness and respect. Maintain a good conscience so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. ¹⁷ For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. ¹⁸ For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. 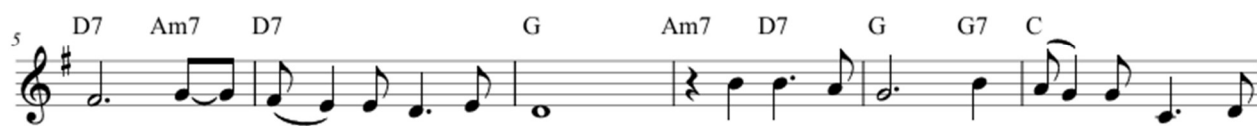

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

The Special Outreach Collection for May – The Omaha Veteran's Pantry

Since opening in October 2025, VA Nebraska-Western Iowa's [Omaha Veterans Food Pantry](#) has become an important resource for Veterans facing food insecurity, a growing challenge that impacts many Veterans. The pantry distributes bags filled with staple foods such as pasta, sauce, peanut butter, canned vegetables, fruit, and soup. Depending on donations, they also include items like snacks. There are two bag styles – one is designed for people with the tools and ability to cook, and the other is filled with items that don't require cooking. Each bag includes about \$30 of groceries. The Omaha Veterans Food Pantry is open Mondays and Wednesdays from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Donations placed in the basket or designated to "VA Food Pantry" in the memo line of checks will go to fund this program as our May special offering. *Thank you for your support of UTO in Lent. A total of \$683.05 was collected! You also raised \$997.00 for Magdalene Omaha in April!*
