On May 22nd, the Vestry (the parish board) met to review regular parish topics, including:

- Reviewing our reports and financial positions from March and April
- Reviewing the upcoming Capital Campaign conclusion and celebration, and the details for the Year Four campaign this coming year
- Noting that Jim Mumgaard and his partners will be re-directing the Brewsky's Open golf fundraiser to a new non-profit being launched by Brewsky's staff around veteran suicide prevention, and how to thank Jim for the support of this fundraiser over the past years
