FROM THE DESK OF THE RABBI

The Blessing of Justice

Those of you who have listened to my teachings over the last two and half years have heard me say multiple times that Judaism has a blessing for *everything*. Whether it's putting on a new article of clothing, eating, learning, seeing someone you haven't seen for a long time, or even seeing lightening or going to the bathroom, there's a blessing Judaism teaches to help us recognize that there is holiness and blessing in even the most mundane activities.

Yet, there is one common Jewish practice that does not have a blessing associated with it: *tzedakah*. Even though it is a *mitzvah*, a commandment prescribed from the Torah, we do not recite the usual blessing for performing a *mitzvah* (“*asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tzivanu...*,” “Who made us holy through the commandments and commanded us...”). This has perplexed rabbis for centuries, producing a variety of answers, such as recognizing that the poor person to whom you're giving your *tzedakah* money might reject it (and you'd thereby not have performed the *mitzvah*); the poor person may be lying and not need the money, so you giving them money is not actually giving *tzedakah*; we should not say a blessing involving someone else's pain, recognizing that the poor person is embarrassed by the fact he/she needs the money; or possibly that we should assume every need for *tzedakah* is urgent and we should not take the time to say a blessing rather than respond to the need in front of us. Each of these answers has been proposed at some point in time.

I would like to offer perhaps another reason. Even though we usually associate in both thought and practice the word *tzedakah* with “charity,” giving to the poor, the word actually means something along the lines of “justice” or “righteousness.” Giving *tzedakah* is not necessarily giving to the poor (though it certainly is included in that category) but is anything we do to make the world more just and righteous. But, creating this world of justice is a never-ending pursuit; giving *tzedakah* doesn't make the world a more just place, but it is a step to help us get there.

As we prepare to honor the memory of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. this month—a man whose major contribution was to help make America a more just and righteous nation through the way it treated all of its citizens (which was one of the reasons he had the support of many Jews), we recognize that we're not there yet. We recognize that, in his own words, “injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere” and there is still injustice in this world.

Therefore, in addition to the regular *tzedakah* you give, we hope you'll join us at our Homestyle Judaism classes, which will focus on the issue of justice in Jewish texts, and for Shabbat on January 18, as we welcome St. Paul CME Church and their pastor, Rev. Da'Henri Thurmond, who will help us think and reflect on Rev. King's legacy and how we can work together to create a world of justice and righteousness—the true goal of *tzedakah*. Maybe then, when we create that world together, we'll have a blessing to recite.

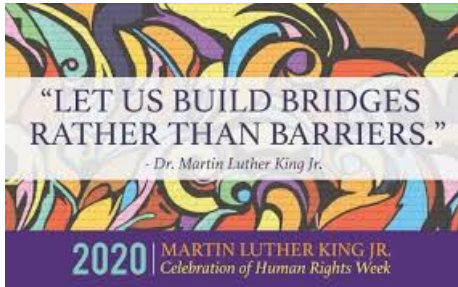
TIME TO *Celebrate*

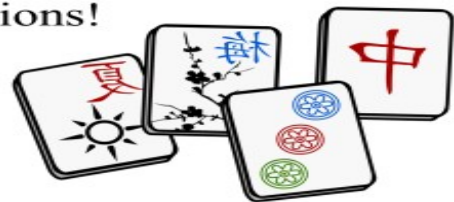
