FROM THE DESK OF THE RABBI

#KislevisforKindness

As we turn to December and reflect on 2019, the past year has given us a lot to think about. While each of us has experienced our own personal ups and downs, as we zoom out, there are progressively more and more times it seems that the darkness in the world is spreading. As a community, we lost a number of congregants this past year, including some who had dedicated decades of their lives to our congregation and to the Savannah Jewish community at large. On a national level, we saw another synagogue shooting and several more desecrated with hate speech and symbols, not to mention the continuation of strained political discourse. And it's not only America; anti-Semitism acts across the globe have risen. Nor is it only Jews, as churches and mosques all over the world have also been attacked. Hatred feels like it has grown more prevalent and more dangerous. For many of us, the bad news, the violence, and the hatred have grown overwhelming. We can hardly bear to see or hear another story on the TV or internet lest it bear more sadness, pain, and darkness.

As we prepare to celebrate Hanukkah at the end of this month, though, we remember one of the main lessons the holiday teaches us: a little bit of light can dispel a lot of darkness. Whether it's a small group of Maccabees fighting off the Greek army or seeing the light of the *menorah* against the backdrop of night, we learn that even one candle can make a difference. It's our job to progressively add more and more light into the world.

Which is where you come in.

With Rosh Hodesh Kislev coming at the end of November, most of December will be spent preparing for Hanukkah. As much as we all enjoy buying and giving gifts for the holiday, the world as we know it needs us to do more. It needs us to bring more light into the world. And with all the hatred, it seems like the best way to do it would be to add more kindness. Starting on November 28, with Rosh Hodesh Kislev, I want to challenge you to not only seek out ways to do acts of kindness, but to share those acts of kindness with the world. 

Or Katan, Or Eitan

A famous Hebrew Hanukka song describes the lights of the menorah as “each one is a small light (*Or katan*) but all of them together are a powerful one (*Or eitan*)”. Like the hanukkiah we are about to light. Like Shalom

School students who often come together as one bright light through the year: Tsedaka, achievements, mitzvah projects... At a time that world problems are so many and so complex, we are, each of us, only one out of 7.5 billion human beings. It feels like a grain of salt in the ocean and it makes it difficult to see the potential power of our personal actions.

The Jewish concept of “Divine Providence” (*Hashgacha Pchatit*) is based on the idea that God gave us certain capacity, certain gifts and put us in a time and place where, if we maximize those gifts and that capacity, we can make a world of difference. The story of baby Moses is a perfect example of that idea: Pharaoh’s daughter happened to be there when Moses’ basket passes by. She heard his cry and, even so she suspected him to be an Israelite baby, she decided to “extend her arm” and help that child.

Very often in life the reason why we don’t do what is good and positive is not because we don’t care, but because we think that whatever we could do doesn’t make a difference, so why bother, why extend our arm? Because Pharaoh’s daughter did extend her arm that day, Hashem extended its reach. She saved a child that not only changed Jewish history but the moral landscape of all mankind.

One of the three core part of Shalom School curriculum is the notion of *Tikkun Olam*, “Repairing the World”: We practice one little mitzvah at a time and we learn how each one of us, even the youngest ones, can make our world a better place. We learn about *Savlanut* (patience) and how to progress one good deed at a time, one day at a time, one person at a time.

God does not ask us to do what we cannot, just do our best, extend our arm. Despite our frailties and seeming insignificance, it is important never to forget that when working together we **can** change the world, one mitzvah at a time.
