Weekly Torah Reading – Pekudei Pshat – The Story at a Glance

- The commandment to keep Shabbat is repeated; one may not kindle fire on Shabbat.
- 2. The Torah recaps the construction of the Mishkan (Tabernacle) and Priestly garments.
- 3. The people bring more than is necessary for completing the Mishkan, and Moses instructs them to stop.
- 4. While Betzalel and Oholiav fashion the Mishkan, Moses inaugurates it.
- 5. The book of Exodus closes with God's presence filling the Mishkan in the form of a cloud, and Moses unable to enter while the cloud filled the space.

Drash - A Closer Look at the Parsha

"And everyone who excelled in ability and everyone whose spirit was moved came, bringing to God an offering for the work of the Tent of Meeting and for all its services and for the sacral vestments" (Ex. 35:21).

We often think of the Israelites as one big group of people and lose sight of their individual abilities. Here, we see the artisans spotlighted as the ones who are going to build and decorate the Tabernacle. Rabbi Yaakov ben Asher, the 13th century German/Spanish commentator, explains that each person utilized their strengths working together. Those who had no training were able to perform tasks they had never considered themselves capable of performing. Artisans who were skilled in performing tasks but had never trained others to do so now became skilled at teaching their art, and men or women who had never displayed skill with their hands were suddenly inspired to do so. They came to Moses' volunteering to perform the tasks that were required.
