### Holiday Torah Reading - Chol Hamoed Sukkot

- Leviticus 23:40-44 describes the four species that we shake throughout Sukkot and instructs the Israelites to dwell in booths for the seven days of the holiday.
- The Maftir, read from the second Torah, reviews the sacrifices brought on this day.
- The Torah reading for Shabbat Sukkot lays out the laws of sacrifice and practice for what is known as the three pilgrimage holidays: Sukkot, Pesach and Shavuot.

- Throughout Sukkot, we wave the lulav and etrog during Hallel. On Shabbat, we still recite Hallel, but do not use the lulav and etrog
