## Pshat - The Story at a Glance

- 1. As we approach the end of the annual Torah reading cycle, Moses sings an elaborate song with a distinct and immediately recognizable layout in the Torah of two columns. Some themes that make up this song include:
  - a. God's endless kindnesses to Israel.
  - b. Israel's prosperity that led them to betray God.
  - c. Israel will suffer for their infidelity, but will eventually return to God.
- 2. At the end of the parsha, God commands Moses to climb Mount Nebo, where he will die overlooking the Promised Land that the rest of the Israelites will soon enter.

## Drash - A Closer Look at this Week's Parsha

"For [the Torah] is not an empty thing for you, for it is your life" (Deuteronomy 32:47).

A midrashic interpretation of this verse explains it to mean that the Torah is not empty, and if you find it to be lacking, the failure comes from you, and not from the text.

Sometimes we read things we don't understand and dismiss it as being esoteric or confusing. Knowing that each word in the Torah is important, this reading explains that it is not the Torah that is empty, but the readers. When one does not understand Torah, one cannot blame the Torah for being empty, but should redouble his or her own effort to understand it.
