Holiday Torah Readings at a glance:

- Day 1—As Shavuot commemorates the Israelites receiving the Torah, on the first day of Shavuot we read what is perhaps the most important scene of in all of Jewish history describing the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai.
- Day 2—Along with Passover and Sukkot, Shavuot is one of the three Pilgrimage Holidays described in the Torah. During all three of those holidays, we read the chapters that lay out the way these days are observed in the Torah. While the specifics of our observance has obviously changed since, you can see the basic outline of religious practice for these days throughout this Torah reading.
