Weekly Torah Reading – Emor

Pshat – The Story

1. The Parsha outlines the laws that apply to the Kohen, the family of Priests who descends from Aaron and serves in the Sanctuary.
2. Not only must the Kohen be ritually and physically fit to serve G-d, the animal offerings must also be unblemished.
3. The Jewish holidays are outlined beginning with Passover and ending with Sukkot/Shmini Atzeret.
4. 50 days must be counted (the Omer) between the 2nd day of Passover and Shavuot.
5. Blasphemy of G-d's name is considered a most serious offense.

Drash – A Closer Look

“The son of the Israelite woman pronounced the Name and blasphemed; they brought him to Moses. His mother’s name was Shlomit daughter of Divri from the tribe of Dan” (Lv. 24:11).

Rashi: [Why does the Torah mention the man’s tribe?] We learn that a wicked person brings disgrace to himself, disgrace to his father, and disgrace to his tribe. Similarly, the Torah tells us that Oholiab was the son of Ahisamach from the tribe of Dan (Ex. 31:6). This righteous person brought honor to himself, honor to his father, and honor to his tribe.

Rashi articulates the truth that we all represent more than ourselves. Whether we do harm or good, the impact of our actions reaches those connected to us: ourselves, our families, and our communities.
