## Pshat – The Story at a Glance

1. Laws are given regulating oaths and vows, which are to be taken most seriously.

2. The tribes of Reuven, Gad, and half of Menashe successfully petition to take their inheritance on the Eastern side of the Jordan River after contributing to the conquest of Israel.

3. The Torah lists the sites passed on the Israelites' 40-year journey from Egypt to Israel.

4. The Israelites are instructed to displace the inhabitants of Canaan and destroy their idols upon their arrival. The tribal leadership and Levitical cities are arranged in advance.

5. Cities of Refuge are designated as safe havens for those who commit unintentional manslaughter.

# Drash – A Closer Look at this week's Parsha

# "And Aaron was 123 years old when he died on Mount Hor" (Numbers 33:39).

This week's parsha mentions the death of Aaron that we had initially read earlier in the book of Numbers. In this instance, the verse ends by specifying that Aaron died on Mount Hor, even though the information is redundant. The sages explain that the verse is written this way, ending with the extra information specifically about Aaron dying on Mount Hor, because we do not want to end with the negative mention of Aaron's death.

This is a lesson for us to follow too in our everyday lives. We should always seek to close conversations or stories with something good, so as not to leave a bitter taste behind.
