Weekly Torah Reading - Parashat Beshalach

Pshat - The Story at a Glance

- 1. The Israelites prepare to finally leave Egypt. The Torah makes special mention of Moses taking the bones of Joseph to bury in Canaan, in accordance with Joseph's dying request at the end of Genesis.
- 2. After letting them go, Pharaoh has a change of heart and sends his army after the Israelites, which causes them to panic and ask Moses why they left in the first place.
- 3. The splitting of the Red Sea allows the Israelites to march through unscathed, while the raging waters drown the Egyptians. When the Israelites reach the other side safely, they sing the Song of the Sea as an acknowledgment of God's protective might.
- 4. Without any water to drink, the Israelites begin complaining. God subsequently provides Manna to eat and water to drink, which only temporarily halts their incessant complaints.
- 5. Israel is attacked by, and fights back against Amalek. The Israelites were famously successful in their battle whenever Moses had his hands raised, with Joshua leading their defeat against their enemy.

Of Note in this week's service

This week's Shabat is Commonly referred to as *Shabbat Shirah* (Shabbat of Song) because we read the Song of the Sea (*Shirat HaYam*) from the Torah, which was jubilantly sung by the Israelites following their successful departure from Egypt. This song encompasses much of Exodus chapter 15, and you can see that the Humash mimics the special line spacing that appears in the actual Torah for this section. In the first line of The Song of the Sea, Exodus 15:1, we read: "Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the Lord". As a way of symbolically reenacting the experience of joining in communal song, many have a custom of standing for this reading, and we will repeat select lines after the Torah reader.
