Pshat - The Story at a glance

- 1. Rebecca gives birth to twins Esau and Jacob.
- 2. Rebecca prefers the younger Jacob while her husband Isaac takes a liking to Esau.
- 3. Esau sells Jacob his birthright in exchange for a bowl of lentils.
- 4. When Isaac is very old, he sends Esau to prepare a meal with the intention of blessing him.
- 5. Rebecca pushes Jacob to take the blessing intended for Esau, and he flees home to escape Esau's wrath.

Drash – A Closer Look at the text

"The boys [Esau and Jacob] grew up. Esau became a trapper, a man of the field, while Jacob was a simple man who stayed in tents." (Gen. 25:27)

Rashi: "As children, their characters were indistinguishable from one another, but once they reached 13, this one [Jacob] drifted toward the house of study while that one [Esau] drifted toward idolatry."

What else can we learn from Jacob being described as a simple man? Rashi further explains that one who is not an expert at deceiving others is described as simple. This detail will play an important part later in the story when we see Jacob's hesitancy to deceive his blind father, Isaac.
