Weekly Torah Reading – Parashat Bo

Pshat – The Story at a Glance

1. The 8th, 9th, and 10th plagues – locusts, darkness and slaying of the firstborn – strike Pharaoh and Egypt.
2. Before they leave Egypt, the Israelites are given the commandment of following a separate Jewish calendar.
3. The Israelites are told to celebrate the Passover holiday in the future.
4. Eating a Paschal lamb and abstaining from leavened food are the key rituals to mark the Exodus' anniversary.
5. The Israelites prepare for their imminent departure from servitude in Egypt.

Drash – A Closer Look at the parsha

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the Land of Egypt; “This month shall mark for you the beginning of the months; it shall be the first of the months of the year for you.” (Exodus 12:1-2).

Why is the fact that this conversation was taking place in the land of Egypt specified here? According to Nachmanides (13th century Spain/Israel), the Torah makes specific mention of the location here because this is the first law that the Israelites would be receiving as a people on the verge of freedom—but that is not the only difference with this commandment. The majority of the laws they receive will be given at Sinai, but this first one is given in Egypt as they prepare to make their exodus and become a nation.
