Weekly Torah Reading - Parashat Lech-Lecha

Pshat - The Story at a glance

- 1. God famously tells Abram to leave his home for the Promised Land, Canaan.
- 2. Abram and his nephew Lot part ways amicably, then Abram rescues him from captivity.
- 3. God makes a covenant with Abram that, following slavery, his descendants will forever inherit Canaan, later known as the land of Israel.
- 4. Sarai kicks out her maidservant Hagar, along with Hagar and Abram's son, Ishmael.
- 5. God changes Abram's name to Abraham and Sarai's name to Sarah as Abraham marks the covenant with God in his flesh through circumcision.

Drash - A Closer Look at this Week's Parsha

God said to Abram, "Go forth (lech lecha) from your native land and from your father's house to the land that I will show you" (Genesis 12:1)

In Hebrew, the word "lecha", meaning "for you", in God's famous instruction of lech lecha appears to be superfluous and does not add any extra meaning. But according to Rashi, the extra lecha helps us understand that Abram is going to make this journey for his own good. It is only once he arrives and settles in his new home that he will earn all the good things coming his way. He has to go from his home for his own benefit.
