## NW WA SWO Board President

Greetings sisters of the NW WA Synod.

This ECHO newsletter is once again published to gather us into communication. It brings awareness of our women's churches and communities, ministries and activities. It informs us of Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (WELCA)'s ministries and resources to help us be engaged.

Our BIENNIAL CONVENTION is October 2 at Our Saviors Lutheran Church in Everett. The church has a large room for us to be safely spaced, as well as masked. We're certain you will enjoy the speakers who will highlight our theme "You Are My Sister.....Do You Know Me?" The very short business session, including elections of the Board begins at 8:30. The Convention Registration form is on page 6. The cost is \$35.00. After September 20<sup>th</sup>--\$40.00.

**NOMINATIONS:** Your churchwomen's Unit needs to elect a Voting Member for the business portion. If your women don't have a structured group, then one of your attendees to the Convention will be appointed as such. She must be a voting member of an ELCA congregation, not necessarily a member of a Unit. Please send her name to the Registrar before Oct. 2<sup>nd</sup>. It can also be marked on the form. Being that we will elect officers and members at large to the Board, nominations are being accepted by our Nominations Chairperson, Gaye Rodriguey. Nominees must be a voting member of an ELCA congregation but not necessarily a member of a Unit. The form for nominations is on page 6, with Gaye's contact information.



The 12<sup>th</sup> TRIENNIAL GATHERING is September 18-24, 2023 in Phoenix, AZ. Our synod will send two Voting Members to the convention (business-18<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup>). We need to elect those two this year. Churchwide WELCA pays for travel to and from Phoenix, as well as room and board for the business portion. The gathering portion begins the 22<sup>nd</sup> and ends Sunday, the 24<sup>th</sup>. It is festive and about 3,000 strong. Since these women will already be there, we will pay their gathering registration cost. The Triennial Voting Member must be a voting member of an ELCA congregation but not necessarily a member of a Unit. Churchwide WELCA encourages us to send a woman of color and/or a person whose primary language is other than English. Women who have attended Triennials before clamor for this opportunity. Your Unit or group can nominate ONE woman. The nominee form (found on page 8) with her name and contact information needs to be sent to me, Maureen Mitchell, no later than October 1<sup>st</sup>.

Start planning to attend the gathering!



She smiled, she sang, she skipped, she laughed. She waved her hand eagerly in hopes of being one of the chosen children to hold letters J, O, Y for a song at preschool bible school. Even when she was not chosen her smile did not fade. She just joined in loudly and sang with the other children, "Joy, joy this is what it means, Jesus first, yourself last and others in between". At four years old Sally was experiencing her first week of bible school. She was enthusiastically in school.

Once, I thought I could have matched her enthusiasm. When had my joy lost its fizz? As I sat there like a wilting houseplant listening to the cheerful singers, I suddenly knew what the problem was...it was the others!

My family's minor problems seemed to add spice to our lives occasionally and always seemed to heal themselves when payday came. I wanted to help others but was afraid they might not welcome my interference, or was I afraid that their problems might be contagious if I got too close? I was becoming adept at turning community problems off at the city limits. Where once I had been interested and informed, I was becoming coolly uninvolved.

It was not until the closing program of the bible school that the children's voices of joy broke through to complete my spring heart cleaning. As I watched the confused shuffle of little people trying to get their letters into the proper order to begin the song, I knew in my heart I had allowed my joy to become scrambled YOJ. It was as if those children were going through the production, waving their J, O, Y and sang, just for me.

How wonderful it has been to discover that God is still there to help, and that recycled joy is as good as new. Almost as a reminder, little Sally bubbles forth often with her song of "Joy". What peace it has brought to know that if I am busy following Jesus, I need not be anxious about what is ahead. He has shown me that if I want to follow him, others are going to be in between. Those others are naturally going to have problems too. We cannot always solve them, but we can lend support through friendships. The real miracle of it all is that with Jesus first, all those others in between...the you does not even realize that it comes last!

## FOR A MEANINGFUL FUTURE Women of the ELCA to Focus on Anti-Racism

WOMEN OF THE ELCA executive board established strategic objectives for the remainder of the 2020-2023 triennium focusing on anti-racism. Both the objectives and campaign came from a task force appointed by churchwide president Lisa Plorin at the board's April 24th meeting. "Racism is a tough subject for many, but with the state our nation is in at this time, we feel it's right to channel the energy of our ministry to address this topic." says Lisa.

The three strategic objectives are anti-racism awareness-raising, accompaniment, and advocacy. With awareness-raising, women will educate themselves to see everything through an anti-racism lens. For accompaniment, European decent women will walk in solidarity with BIPOC (black, indigenous, people of color) women in the struggle for racial equity by developing authentic relationships. With the advocacy focus, women will live out our Lutheran belief that government can help advance the common good, focusing specifically on ant-racism issues.

"As the executive board of the Women of the ELCA looked to the future, we acknowledge our roots in ant-racism," said Rev. Vivian Thomas-Breitfeld, chair of the strategic planning task force. Thomas-Breitfeld said returning to the "hard work of authentic anti-racism felt Spirit-led. We are bold women heeding the call to lead our church into authentic anti-racism, that welcomes all people enabling us to become the beloved community that God calls us to be."

Vice-president Becky Shurson echoed the hope expressed by Thomas-Breitfeld. "Because of each executive board member's commitment to ant-racist training, we are on the journey now," she said. "That training has been one of the greatest gifts this organization has given me, and I am grateful."

## TREASURER'S REPORT

Thank you to **Oak Harbor, St. Luke's, Queen Anne, and Grace, Cross of Christ Lutheran** Churches for your offering donations to the Northwest Synodical Women's Organization. Your donations make it possible for us to keep in touch through the ECHO, Retreats, and Convention gatherings. One half of your offering donations have been sent to Women of the ELCA (churchwide). These offerings provide you with resources such as Gather magazine, CAFÉ, daily meditations. To date \$829.00 have been sent to churchwide.

Many units no longer have structurally organized women's groups. We know they are still active doing God's Work – Through Their Hands. Units are conducting Bible studies, book discussions, serving homeless populations, planting, harvesting, and collecting food for food banks, making quilts and kits for local populations and Lutheran World Relief. Units also may have other projects that demonstrate their good works.



If SWO retreats and/or conventions have education and/or inspirational value for you, consider collecting an occasional offering or selling a quilt and donating the proceeds to SWO as a gift. One half of any gift is sent to churchwide.

Though units no longer have structures to select representatives, it is important for women to talk together and choose how they would like to be represented in groups such as SWO, churchwide, and Triennial. SWO conventions are one of the ways you as women are represented in the Women of the ELCA.
