

LWVIL STATE PROGRAM PLANNING REPORT FOR THE 2017-2019 BIENNIUM

Program Planning Summary

The local League program recommendations for 2017-2019 are itemized on the following pages and have been reviewed and considered by the Issues Committee. Recommendations are based on the responses of 16 Leagues representing 43% of all local leagues in Illinois. These local Leagues reported 291 member participants representing an estimated 1290 members from those Leagues.

Participating Leagues overwhelmingly recommended retention of all current positions. Updates/new study recommendations were proposed by at most one League which indicated a willingness to lead the effort. At this time, those Leagues are still considering whether they will be ready to propose an update/new study at the convention.

I. Recommended Program Items

The LWVIL Issues Committee recommends the following items be presented to the 2017 convention delegates for consideration as the Recommended Program:

1) Readopt Current Positions

- a. Representative Government - Retain all positions.
- b. Natural Resources - Retain all positions.
- c. Social Policy - Retain all positions

2) Action Foci for the 2017-2019 Biennium (in alphabetical order)

- a. Election Laws including Voting Rights, Redistricting, and Campaign Finance
- b. Environmental Issues
- c. ERA
- d. Fiscal Policies with a particular focus on Education and Human Services
- e. Gun Violence Prevention
- f. Healthcare and Reproductive Choices
- g. Immigration

3) State Board recommendations of additions/corrections

- a. Election laws:
 - i. "A combined in-person, **digital**, and mail registration system should be maintained."
- b. Mental Health:
 - ii. "A comprehensive and coordinated system of services for ~~mentally ill adults and emotionally disturbed children and adolescents'~~ **mental/behavioral health**. The ~~Department of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities~~ **Illinois Department of Human Services** should ensure both adequate state hospitals and community services to treat and rehabilitate the seriously mentally ill. These services should be integrated

with those of other state agencies.” These services should be integrated with those of other state agencies.”

c. School Finance:

- i. The League believes that “Pre-Kindergarten through 12th grade public schools should be provided stable, reliable, and adequate revenue through a combination of federal, state, and local sources.”

4) Concurrence:

Recommended: Higher Education Funding position of Central Kane County

The Central Kane County League supports sustained allocation of state funds for public higher education that will provide quality postsecondary programs throughout the state.

Objectives for adequate public funding should be to:

- Provide affordable educational opportunities which foster global competitiveness for the people of Illinois and their employers
- Eliminate and prohibit barriers to funding higher education: constitutional, statutory, and regulatory
- Invest in capital construction and long-term maintenance of higher education facilities
- Attract, maintain, and retain quality teaching staff

In addition, the League supports sustained funding to attract, support, and retain qualified Kane County students through:

- State-funded, need-based financial aid
- State-funded, merit-based scholarships
- State-funded grants paying for research assistantships
- State-subsidized internships

II. Non-Recommended Program Items

According to the LWVIL bylaws, only program items submitted three months in advance of the convention are eligible for consideration by the convention. The following items were submitted in Program Planning and any of them may be moved for consideration at convention after the recommended program is presented. Further details on how to move non-recommended program items are outlined in the proposed convention rules.

- Term Limits for leadership positions – League not willing to lead a study to update
- Merit Selection of judges – League not willing to lead a study to update
- County Government – study not specified
- Reducing number of governmental units in Illinois – Leagues need to consider implications of the current position
- Electronic vs. scanned/paper trail ballots – LWVUS updated their position;
- Redistricting by an independent commission – LWVUS updated their position;
- Fracking – LWVUS position covers it

- Water – study not specified
- Mental Health – The Issues Specialist believes that the concerns are currently addressed. Discussions are underway.
- School Quality – Rockford and Central Kane members are considering changes needed
- Fiscal policy: study the “expenditure” side of fiscal policy to balance the revenue position – League not willing to lead a study to update. The Issues Committee thinks that the LWVIL positions in *Where We Stand* support adequate and consistent spending for education, human services and other issues. The Fiscal Policy position describes how LWVIL thinks the state should raise money. The other positions describe how the monies should be spent.
- Criminal Justice -study updating criminal/juvenile justice (see separate attachment in this E-News from Janet Kittlaus, LWVIL Criminal Justice Specialist).
