CROSSTOWN'S 2021 VERSE OF THE YEAR

Hebrews 12:1-3

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles.

And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

Directions: Four prayer stations are setup with activities and are meant to support you through your prayer time. Please feel free to pray though the additional requests listed or read through Psalms. This is your time to be with God in prayer, meditation, and worship. If you are joining us from home, we encourage you to gather a couple items (your phone/tablet, your Bible, a glass of water, a rock, post-it note or paper, and a candle).

Guide for the Prayer Stations

STATION 1 spiritual practice video from Amy Ponce



Follow this QR code or use the link in your app to utilize this spiritual practice video. Relax. Breathe. God is not only with you but He wants to be with you. Think about letting go of the things that are distracting you from God. Imagine your hands releasing these things and letting them drop. You can imagine dropping them into the hands of Christ, at the foot of the cross, or at the feet of Jesus, seated on the throne. Offer God a prayer, telling him you're open to receive whatever he has to give you today.

STATION 2 Stones dropping into a pool prayer / Letting go

In front of you is a pile of stones and a water pail surrounded by landscape blocks. Take a stone from the pile. Imagine that all your concerns and worries are held in the stone. Hold the stone tightly and name the concerns and worries in your mind. Hold the stone over the pool of water. In your own time let it go.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, Hebrews 12:1

Pray: Oh Lord Jesus, we praise You for the example we have in Jesus Christ, Your Son. Thank You that we are surrounded by this body of believers and this great cloud of witnesses! Help us, Father, to lay aside everything that weighs us down, and the sin that so easily entangles us. Help us to run with perseverance the race that You've marked out for us. Strengthen us to fix our eyes on You and You alone, the author and perfecter of our faith. Thank You for hearing our prayers. Father, thank You for the promises You've spoken over my life. Help me to rise, be strong and press forward. Today I choose to let go of anything that would hold me back from boldly embracing everything You have in store for me. Father, today and every day I set my focus on you. I declare that I will not look to the left or to the right, but I will fix my eyes on Jesus, the Author and Finisher of my faith. Give me wisdom and grace as I dedicate every area of my life to You in Jesus' name!

Ask God in Prayer:

What is God speaking to Crosstown through this verse?
Praise God that He has a plan for each of us who are in Christ!
Pray that we would find our hope and comfort in God.
Pray that God will help remove things that hinder your relationship with Him.
Pray Philippians 4:4-9

STATION 3 Write your request/desire on a post-it note paper

As you write, pray for God to make you more aware of fixing your eyes on Jesus. You can write more than one paper. When you have written on your paper place these around the station / white board. *If you are participating at home and would like your prayer to be added to the cross at church please email it to Pastor John, pastorjohn@crosstowncovenant.org

Pray: Jesus, we fix our eyes on You. You showed us the beginning and end of faith, revealing the perfection and completion of a faith-full life. Begin and complete such faith in us. Jesus, we fix our eyes on You and build our lives upon You. May our faith grow stronger daily until we see Your face in that final day. Dear Lord, I know you have a plan for my life, and I thank you for that plan. Thank you for the examples in your word of those who have persevered through faith. As I run my race help me set aside any excess weight that is holding me down. Help me say no to responsibilities that I'm not currently meant to carry. If there is sin in my life, give me eyes to see it

and turn from it. Help me always keep my eyes fully focused on you so that I may have endurance to follow your path for my life. Help me Look to you O Lord and your strength; help me seek your face always.

Ask God in Prayer:

To give you an increasing desire to spend time in His word To help you realize you rely on Him to increase your faith What is God speaking to you through this verse? Pray Psalm 123 Read text from hymn "Turn your eyes upon Jesus"

STATION 4 Battery led Candles in front of the Cross Light a candle and place it in front of the cross. Use it as a symbolic prayer.

For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart. Hebrews 12:2-3

Pray: Jesus, there are times that I feel alone in my life journey, but I know that is not the case. I thank you for my brothers and sisters in Christ. Thank you for always being there and for loving me. Be with me today. I choose to trust in you, to break free of the things that hold me back, and to pursue to you. Your love, your hope, your peace and the promise of eternity. Lord come and inspire me and meet with me as I pray. O Lord I come to worship and bow down in my prayer, And kneel before you Lord, my creator, savoir and heavenly Father! Hear my prayer, lead and guide me, teach me your love, and show me your ways.

Ask God in Prayer:

Thank Him for specific areas in life where you sensed His protection and love. Pray for His protections for members of Crosstown and your family. Pray Isaiah 55:6 "Seek the Lord while he may be found; call on him while he is near." Pray Psalm 11 Pray Psalm 63
