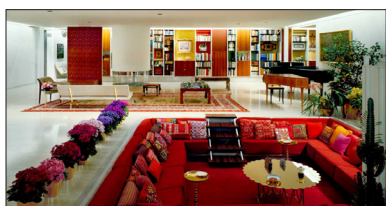
Tour | Inquire for times available | Cathedral City California Modern: Albert Frey's The Cree House

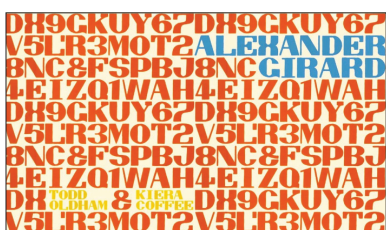


Exhibit | Palm Springs Art Museum Alexander Girard: A Designer's Universe

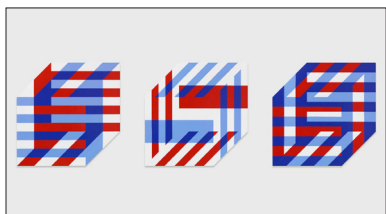


Exhibit | Architecture + Design Center Jim Isermann. Copy. Pattern. Repeat.
