# STEWARDSHIP



***“Giving your time, your talents, and your tithes to God’s work...”***

Prayer- God, thank you for the sacrifice of your Son, Jesus, who was crucified, died, was buried, and rose again on the third day for my sins.

## **The Resurrection as Key to Christian Stewardship- Luke 24:1-12**

The resurrection is the key to understanding Christian stewardship because it is the key to Christianity. In the resurrection of Jesus, God signals his intention to restore human life and all of creation, reversing the curse and decay caused by the fall and straightening this “bent” world. Jesus’ new incorruptible body indicates that God is not going to do away with the physical world; he is redeeming and transforming it. Jesus has defeated death and is now bringing all God’s enemies under his feet. Not only this, but he promises that those who overcome through faith in him will rise again and reign with him eternally in a re-created new earth.

The resurrection of Christ from the dead is the foundation event of the new age which began with him, comparable only to creation when life itself began... It is by this resurrection power that the church lives and carries out its mission. Its sacraments are an actual communion with the living Lord. Its members “taste the powers of the world to come” for by his resurrection Christ has brought into the present the world to come, and faith is the access to this life. We “rise with Christ into a newness of life” and become the channels through which life flows into the world. Thus to pray with Paul that we “may know the power of his resurrection” is to seek the deepest meaning and the richest resources of our stewardship... Christian stewardship takes on nothing less than cosmic significance. Its aim is the restoration of all areas of life to its right Lord.

Without this cosmic vision and eternal perspective, we are tempted to focus on the world around us, believing that what happens now is all that matters and that our only hope for material rewards, relationships, pleasures, comfort, justice and mercy are found in this life. But because this new resurrection power is at work in us, we can live as nearly as we can to that final state of perfection by the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead (see *Romans 8:10-11*).

## Palm Procession

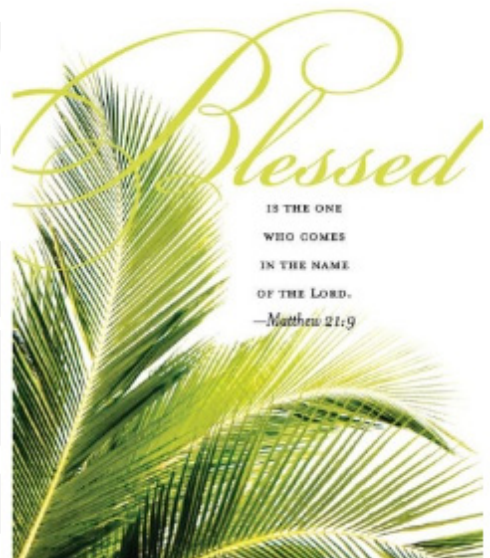
