

PASTOR'S LETTER

"I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him..." -Ephesians 1:17

Dear Church Family,

Our sermon series this winter emphasizes the spirit of unity that we can experience in Christ. The apostle Paul opens the letter with what John Stott describes as, "an outburst of adoration." Paul is unconcerned with apologetics or scientific proofs and simply declares the majesty and greatness of the Lord. As the introduction shifts into a prayer, Paul then expresses his desire for believers to come to know the many blessings that we already possess through our faith in Jesus- the hope of our calling (salvation, fellowship, holiness, etc.), the riches of His glorious inheritance (our value in His sight!), and the immeasurable greatness of His power (resurrection power, headship over all creation for the church). My prayerful hope is that this sermon series will help inspire continued spiritual formation that deepens our relationship with God. This fits with our first prong of our church's vision- the desire to see every member grow in their faith. If we progress in this direction, we will inevitably experience a strengthening of unity in Christ.

I encourage you to read the newsletter and February calendar. If you do not have a connecting point for spiritual development (Sunday School, Bible study, circle group, etc.), I would challenge you to seek one out or contact Pastor Jason or myself to help you find a group that might be right for you.

STEWARDSHIP



“Giving your time, your talents, and your tithes to God’s work...”

Prayer- Jesus, as you gave your life freely, I want to give sacrificially and with joy. Holy Spirit, I can’t do so without your filling and your power. I humbly ask for both.

A Heart for Giving! - 2 Corinthians 9 : 6-15

What a remarkable passage on giving. **“Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously.”** The laws of harvest operate not only in the natural, but also in the spiritual realm. This principle is true in all areas of Christian experience, especially in the area of giving. The believer recognizes that giving is not a question of scattering, but of sowing and that- since all giving constitutes a challenge of faith- it is not a contribution, but an investment.

(Expository preacher Stephen F. Olford, 1918-2004).

“Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion.” These offerings can be somewhat sporadic, spontaneous, unpredictable, and reflective of our varying levels of enthusiasm and areas of commitment. They can be spirit-led: we are free to follow our conscience and our intuition in deciding how much to give and when to give it. There is great joy in such giving, for we are not merely fulfilling a basic responsibility but, in truth, are opening our hearts to the goodness of God. It is in such giving that we become generous people. It is in such giving that we become grateful people. Indeed, it is in such giving that we become godly people. (Theologian Mark Allan Powell).

“God loves a cheerful giver.” The more we give, the more we delight in our giving- and the more God delights in us. Our giving pleases us. But more importantly, it pleases God. This doesn’t mean we should give only when we’re feeling cheerful. The cheerfulness often comes during and after the act of obedience, not before it. So don’t wait until you feel like giving- it could be a long wait! Just give and watch the joy follow. God delights in our cheerfulness in giving. He wants us to find joy. He even commands us to rejoice. What command could be a greater pleasure to obey than that one? But if we don’t give, we’re robbed of the source of joy God instructs us to seek! VBS Planning Committee Meeting






This year the Mission Committee is partnering with Lifewater to focus our efforts on providing clean water for a vulnerable community in Bensa, Ethiopia.

Lifewater is a charitable Christian organization which works to provide clean water for communities, as well as education on how to lead a healthy and clean lifestyle regarding water quality. We would like to raise funds for a water well in Bensa, Ethiopia which would serve around 200 people.

Safe water is a vital part of life. Without a well, women and children are forced to walk multiple miles and hours each day to unsafe water sources and carry it back to their village for drinking, cooking, and cleaning. Often the journey to water sources is unsafe. In addition, traveling multiple hours every day keeps children out of school. Finally, this water often causes illness which can lead to malnutrition, dehydration, and even death.

Lifewater helps communities establish wells within one kilometer, or a little over half a mile, of each home in the village. In addition, they incorporate a "wash program" which teaches the community sanitary care including but not limited to, sanitary restrooms, how to handle kitchen items away from animals, and implementing hand washing stations.

You may be asking yourself where the staff and funds for these projects come from. That is where we come in! Funds are raised via our charitable donations, but also require community buy-in from the villagers. Each village has a 20% work and cost buy-in by the local population and a well committee is formed. The families are charged a very small fee each month so that funds may be accumulated to repair the well and pump when problems arise. "Wash technicians" are hired from the local villages and are partnered with Christian church building partnerships.

So as you can see, these projects not only establish a clean water source, they also establish a sense of ownership and community, jobs, and an opportunity for prosperity! The goal is to create a clean water source that can be sustained by the village so that they are not reliant on continued support from donations.

Lifewater provides over-site for 5 years to be sure that the well remains functional, and they remain available to the community after those 5 years as needed for problems that are unmanageable by the local water committee.
