pastor's letter

Dear Church Family,

Our session voted on Sunday evening (8/7/22) to offer a third worship service as well as to consolidate our current Sunday school program. The service times will be at 8:30 am (contemporary), 10am (contemporary), and 11:15 am (traditional). The Sunday school program will be offered at 10am (for all ages and stages). After two session meetings with lengthy conversation, our elders agreed on the change with a couple of driving factors in mind. **First, this change will give people full access to all Sunday school classes.** Thus, whether a family or individual prefers contemporary or traditional, they will be able to pick a style and still attend the Sunday school offering of their choice (all ages and stages). **Secondly, this change will allow for continued growth with minimal disruption.** The contemporary service experienced exceptional growth over the past year. As your pastor, I wish we could just break down the walls and expand the space in the room. In a perfect world, we would simply keep the two services with a Sunday school hour in the middle. However, the sanctuary can accommodate up to 300-400 while the 143 building maxes out at only 200.

We did our best to keep the traditional service near the 11am hour (rather than shift to an earlier time slot less desirable to most) because we believe that it is now in position for future growth with the return of the choir and our church's full commitment to this style. **Lastly, the 10am service (contemporary) will not have a Sunday school offering before or after the service.** I believe strongly that the two Sunday school hours have been tremendously confusing and that any family truly desiring to attend Sunday school will still have the ability to do so by worshipping at 8:30am or 11:15am. For those who choose to worship at 10am, I will strongly encourage them to get involved in mid-week bible studies or small groups. If anyone needs help finding a group or forming a group, Pastor Jason and I will be more than willing to help.

Stepping back to see the "big picture," I am blown away by how the Lord has protected us during a time in which many churches are struggling. We have not simply treaded water throughout the pandemic, but we have experienced tangible growth. Our \$1 million capital campaign is now within \$20,000 of being complete, our financial giving has increased steadily, and we are seeing a tremendous surge in new people joining our church as new covenant partners (members). Back in 2016, we made a commitment to not only leave our old denomination (PCUSA to ECO), but to implement a 3-pronged vision: 1) to see every member grow spiritually (discipleship), 2) to make our spaces more welcoming (like our people), and 3) to reach the younger generation with the gospel (while staying fully committed to intergenerational ministry). Although our changes may not be ideal for some or perfect for many, we will continue to move forward with the Lord's guidance and make adjustments along the way. Praise be to God for His hand in our growth!

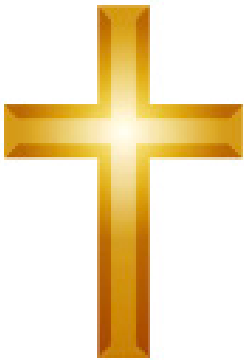

Whatever Happened to Real Food? – Psalm 107: 8-9

God has always been in the business of filling hungry souls with good things. In terms of physical nutrition, though, the picture has changed drastically from Old Testament days. The Israelites survived on manna the Lord miraculously provided each day – the Lord, who “gave you manna to eat in the desert, something your fathers had never known, to humble and to test you so that *in the end it might go well with you.*” The testing was no doubt good for God’s people – but so was the food.

Americans today have the most abundant supply of food in the world and the most efficient means of distributing it to everyone. We have created powerful agencies to ensure that our food is honestly represented to us and free from harmful substances. Furthermore, we spend countless millions of dollars in food research.

We also have thousands of highly trained doctors, extremely sophisticated medical facilities, and medical research programs supported by millions of dollars. Yet for some reason we really don’t feel well.

We have allowed the food and beverage industries to convert us from God’s natural provisions to their own highly processed and synthetic concoctions. Our tastes have been so perverted that we have forgotten how real food tastes. Our reasoning has become so distorted that we allow advertisements to persuade us that refined, depleted, processed foods and beverages, full of chemical additives, modified starch, imitation flavor, imitation color and sugar, are superior to real food.

Technology is rapidly breaking down the basic structure of plant and animal life in many ways, and we haven’t asked whether science is monitoring the results of these basic changes in health to the human being.

This trend away from being satisfied with God’s natural provisions is not unique to North Americans. Most people pursue what is easiest and what is most pleasurable, and often the easiest is the most unhealthy. God’s desire is for us to treat our bodies as living and holy sacrifices, and sometimes that means we are to make choices that may not be the easiest but, in the end, are the best choices.

We have had a Logos program at First Presbyterian since Fall 1979, and are grateful to build on this long-lasting program. Logos/MSM is a mid-week program for children and youth in 1st – 8th grades. The goal of the program is the same as it was in 1979 – to develop genuine and lasting relationships between young people and Jesus Christ, between young people and their ministers, parents and other adults in the congregation, and their peers.

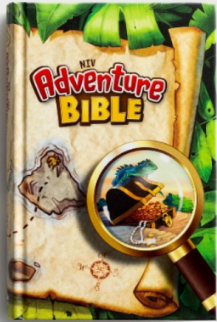

Missions Update

Dear First Presbyterian Church,

Good afternoon and God bless you all. I pray you and your families are doing well. I have some great news to share with you. I can't thank you enough for the encouragement and opportunity you provided. Thank you for letting me share Lifewater's story with your congregation. I was blessed and hundreds of lives received safe water, sanitation, and hygiene education through your compassion and generosity. Which leads me to the best part.

I received information on how your support was allocated. If you recall, you designated your support to Bensa, Ethiopia. I am happy to say, I have an update on a completed project in the region that your support helped make possible.



<< This was the original water point in Bensa, Ethiopia. It was an old system that was not protected and the water was contaminated by wild and domestic animals. Located outside the village of West Abaya Hora, this was the primary source of water for a village of 53 families. The total population recorded in the area was 319.



<< This is the final water point, a storage tank that is part of a new pipe system. It provides protected, safe water to the village with multiple taps to reduce overcrowding and time waiting. That helps keep disease from spreading and saves mothers time.

I am thrilled beyond measure to provide you this update. It feels as though this has come full circle from our first introduction. I am humbled and honored to have worked with you in transforming these lives, thank you. I am still in the same position at Lifewater; however, my primary responsibilities will be stewarding relationships in the central part of the country. We want you to feel comfortable reaching out to either one of us should you need anything.

The work going on in Uganda, Tanzania, Ethiopia, and Cambodia is still going strong. Please keep us in your prayers as we enter the second half of the year. We have a lot of work to do.
