# PASTOR'S LETTER

**“Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the first fruits of all your produce.”  
– Proverbs 3:9**

Dear Church Family,

I want to take a moment to share both heartfelt gratitude and a word of thoughtful guidance. First, I am deeply thankful for the generosity that has been shown toward the Legacy Campaign. Our Phase 1 goal is \$1.85 million, and to date we have already seen \$1.4 million pledged, with nearly \$700,000 received. This shows the dedication of our church community. At the same time, I want to offer an important clarification. Legacy gifts are intended to be given above and beyond our regular annual giving, which supports our operating budget. Several have asked how best to divide their giving, and my consistent counsel has been this: if a contribution to the Legacy Campaign would reduce your annual pledge, it is wiser—and completely appropriate—to focus your giving on the operating budget instead. Our operating budget is what enables the daytoday ministry of our church. It allows us to serve, disciple, and reach our community faithfully. If we fall short of meeting that budget in the coming year, we will be faced with some very difficult decisions next December. For that reason, it is essential that our ongoing ministry remains fully supported, even as we pursue this exciting long-term vision together. Thank you again for your generosity, your wisdom, and your continued faithfulness to the mission God has entrusted to us.

# JUST A THOUGHT...

## The Courage to Bring it to the Lord

This morning, a short poem from a devotional stopped me in my tracks. Margaret Sangster writes:

*The little sharp vexations  
And the briars that catch and fret,  
Why not take all to the Helper  
Who has never failed us yet?  
Tell Him about the heartache,  
And tell Him the longings, too;  
Tell Him the baffled purpose  
When we scarce know what to do.  
Then, leaving all our weakness  
With the One divinely strong,  
Forget that we bore the burden,  
And carry away the song.*  
- Margaret Sangster

That line—*the One who has never failed us yet*—has been lingering with me.

I come from a church background where worship was often expressed through song and dance, lights and movement, sound and spectacle. It was powerful. Moving. Electric. You could leave feeling charged up in your faith, convinced you had encountered the presence of God; and in many ways, you had. God truly meets His people in joy, celebration, and embodied praise. But the harder part of that context was what didn't always happen. There were fewer moments to slow down. Fewer spaces for quiet discipleship. Less room to admit weakness, confusion, or weariness. Less opportunity to sit with one another in the ordinary, unspectacular struggles of life and ask, *How is your soul really doing?*

Fast forward to our own church context. We don't have smoke machines or large ensembles or flags waving in the sanctuary, and that's not a critique. Genuine worship looks different in different places and cultures. Here, we prioritize fellowship, biblical study, and expository preaching that places Christ at the center and keeps the gospel front and center every Sunday and every day. These are deep gifts.

And yet, a theme I keep noticing among many of us is this: we carry quiet sufferings.

We believe in prayer. We affirm its importance. We know, theologically, that God invites us to bring everything before Him. But I wonder how many of us try to tough it out before Christ. How many of us carry the weight a little longer than we need to. How many of us tell ourselves, *I'll pray about it once I get stronger... once it's less messy... once I have better words... once I feel less ashamed.*

Here's something I've learned across every church I've served, past and present: the persona we show on Sunday morning can be very different from the truth of our lives in the quiet places. Shame, guilt, fear of burdening others, people-pleasing, or simply cultural habits can make us hesitant to ask for prayer or open up about what's really happening in our hearts.

And here's the even more surprising truth: pastors struggle with this too.

This is not a failure of faith. It's the human condition. We all quietly struggle. We all suffer in ways that don't always have language. And when people are asked about their prayer lives, about what they're hearing from God or wrestling with in His Word, sometimes there isn't much to say. Not because God is silent, but because the hardest things haven't yet been brought before Him. They feel too heavy. Too dark. Too weak. Too shameful.

Scripture knows this reality well. Psalm 27 gives voice to what it looks like to seek the Lord in the midst of fear and adversity. David doesn't pretend he's fine. He names threats, enemies, and trembling. And yet the psalm ends not with despair, but with a quiet, stubborn hope: *"I believe that I shall see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living."* Then comes the invitation: *"Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage."*

I wonder what kind of courage we need in this season of life. Not the courage to perform. Not the courage to pretend we're unbothered. But the courage the poem invites us into—the courage to open up to the Lord, who has never failed us yet. The courage to bring the "little sharp vexations" and the deep, unnamed griefs. The courage to leave our weakness with the One who is divinely strong.

And perhaps, alongside that, the courage to open up to one another. What if this season is an invitation to humbly approach God—not once we've cleaned ourselves up, but right where we are? What if it's a time to confess, to lean into His strength, and to lay down the burdens we've been gripping too tightly? And what if it's also a reminder that we are not alone—that the people sitting around us in the pews are carrying many of the same weights?

When we remember that, it changes how we see one another. It invites grace instead of judgment. Compassion instead of assumptions. Welcome instead of distance.

May we be a people who bring our burdens to the Helper who has never failed us yet—and who walk together, gently and honestly, as we wait for the goodness of the Lord to meet us here.

Many of you have noticed that Greg Thompson recently moved to the piano during worship because our 55 year old Reuter organ is no longer functioning. This organ has served us well and its lifespan has been long. As we worship God every Sunday we will not depend on any instrument in lifting our voices in song to God. We still have our voices. There is something powerful in hearing the saints singing together. God gave us our voices and they are the first instruments. God wants to hear you use your voice to praise Him. I encourage you to think of how the early reformed church would only sing Psalms without any accompaniment. The Lord has put it on my heart to incorporate singing the Psalms more in our worship. The Psalter is rich with every possible emotion we experience in this life: pain, praise, thanksgiving, prayer, repentance, and intercession are just a few. There are different types of Psalm singing. Our church benefits most from singing the Psalms set to familiar hymn tunes. As we continue our Lenten journey I pray we would look to the songs of Jesus or the Psalter as a primary way to sing praises to God.

## Easter Prayer Vigil

As we prepare to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ, we invite you to draw near to Him through a prayer vigil. This vigil begins at 8:00 PM on Maundy Thursday (April 2nd) and continues through noon on Good Friday (April 3rd). To participate, simply sign up for a one-hour prayer slot at a time that works best for you. The worship space in the 143 building will be open and softly lit through the night. Seven interactive prayer stations will guide participants in reflection, confession, gratitude, intercession, and global mission prayer. You are welcome to move freely between stations or simply sit in quiet prayer. Come for one hour or stay longer.



Alternatively, you are also welcome to pray from home. This vigil provides a special opportunity to answer the relational call Jesus gave His disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane: to keep watch with Him in prayer. This vigil provides space to remain spiritually attentive rather than returning to distraction or routine. To ensure that each hour of the vigil is covered in prayer, we are asking participants to sign up in advance through SignUpGenius. # STEWARDSHIP

---

**GIVING YOUR TIME, YOUR TALENTS, AND YOUR TITHES TO GOD'S WORK...**

**PRAYER:** *Awesome God, you are my light-giver. You brighten the dark corners of my soul. Help me to share with others the light of life.*

**Houses of Prayer; Houses of Light - 1 Chronicles 29: 10 – 20**

In anticipation of temple construction, David offers a remarkable prayer, a prayer that serves as a template or model for each of us as God's stewards. The prophet Isaiah later refers to that very temple as God's "house of prayer" (Isa 56:7). And David himself anticipates that reality, declaring in Psalm 18:6, "In my distress I called to the LORD; I cried to my God for help. From his temple he heard my voice; my cry came before him, into his ears." A house of prayer.

In Psalm 18:28, David uses imagery that permeates Scripture, saying, "My God turns my darkness into light." An unmistakable message. A house of light.

Pastor John Timmer relates a simple story about a house in need of light:

Once upon a time a man lived in a house without a window. Naturally, it was very dark inside his house. One day he said to himself, "I'm sick and tired of living in a dark house, I want to get rid of the darkness. I want light instead of darkness."

So what did he do? He took a large pail, filled it with darkness, carried it outside, and emptied it. Then he went back into the house and did the same thing all over again. He filled the pail with darkness, carried it outside, and emptied it. He did this all day. But by the end of the day his house was just as dark as it had always been.

Then the man said to himself, "This isn't going to work. This is not the way to get rid of the darkness. There must be another way. But how?"

That night he went to bed, very tired and very sad. But when he woke up the next morning, the answer came to him. "Now I know how to get rid of the darkness," he said. He took a big hammer, knocked a big hole in the outside wall, and made a window. Through this window the bright sunlight came pouring into his house.

Our lives are like a house without a window. It's dark inside. To make it light inside, we need a window, a window through which God's light will come pouring into our lives.

Prayer is such a window. Without prayer, our lives are dark. With prayer, our lives are light. Each time we pray, God's light comes pouring into our lives.

Today God dwells in clay houses (see 2Co 4:7) – houses that nonetheless reflect his glory to a sin-darkened world. Like breath, the light not only pours in but gets exhaled right back out? Houses of light; houses of prayer.
