PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Church Family,

Earlier this year, at the annual officer retreat, Tom Kirkland shared concerns with our elders about our aging facility. His visual presentation was persuasive, and our group concluded that it was necessary to address these tangible needs without further delay. A vision team was formed to prayerfully address these concerns and assess areas needing improvement. The team consists of Zach Miller (facilitator), Tom Kirkland, Liz Rader Lumadue, Al White, John Robertson, Tee Stanley, Denise Tidball, Sue Stevens, Donna Welsh, Pastor Moses Camacho, as well as myself.

With guidance from our property committee and valuable contributions from staff, we addressed critical concerns including aging infrastructure, sanctuary accessibility, space renovations, restroom facilities, the pipe organ, stained glass windows, elevator functionality, and other related matters. The vision team came to this conclusion, in the words of Liz Rader Lumadue:

This congregation has used its resources wisely over the years and kept our facility operating. But the life of our infrastructure is nearly over. We must address serious issues now in order to meet future needs. To move forward confidently in ministry and service, to be the warm welcoming church we want to be, to be good stewards of the buildings the Lord has given us, the time has come to do more than patch and repair and hold our breath for another winter or summer. The time has come to make our Sanctuary truly accessible to all, to make our Education Building efficient, safe, and attractive, to leave a solid legacy for future generations of Presbyterians who call this church their home.

The vision team pitched formal recommendations to our session on Sunday, October 26th. The plan includes a capital campaign called The Legacy Campaign to raise \$4.35M. The overall plan received unanimous approval. A portion of the plan (handicap accessibility) was set aside to discuss and eventually received approval as well- minus one “no” vote and one “abstain” vote.

The Legacy Campaign will be announced at the 150th Year Celebration luncheon on Sunday, November 9th, followed by two Q & A sessions and guided tours at later dates in November. There will be an opportunity to pledge towards this project on Sunday, December 7th. Please feel free to approach any portion of our church leadership with questions or concerns and prayerfully consider your support towards this vision.

It continues to be a privilege to serve alongside you in ministry!

JUST A THOUGHT...

Just a Thought: Assurance in the Midst of Groaning (Romans 8)

Romans 8 is often called the mountain peak of the New Testament, and for good reason. It begins with “no condemnation” and ends with “no separation.” Between those two declarations of grace, Paul walks us through the valleys of life—naming our weakness, our suffering, and even our groaning—but always reminding us that the Spirit of God walks with us.

The gospel doesn’t promise a life free from hardship; it promises deliverance within it. We are not lifted above struggle but carried through it by the Spirit who gives life. The same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead now lives in us, reminding us that our hope is not wishful thinking—it’s resurrection power in real time.

When life feels heavy and your prayers feel wordless, Romans 8 tells us something astonishing: “The Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans.” God’s Spirit prays when we can’t, holds us when we fall, and keeps us when our faith feels faint. And then Paul concludes with the loudest assurance of all: “Nothing in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.”

This November—when the world turns colder and gratitude can feel like a discipline—remember that the Spirit who indwells you is also interceding for you. You are not condemned, not alone, and not beyond hope. The Father has written your story in grace, the Son has secured your pardon, and the Spirit is leading you toward glory.

Take a moment this week to pray: “Abba, Father, thank You that nothing can separate me from Your love. Teach me to walk by Your Spirit today—with freedom, with hope, and with confidence in Christ. Amen.”

STEWARDSHIP

GIVING YOUR TIME, YOUR TALENTS, AND YOUR TITHES TO GOD'S WORK...

PRAYER: *Holy Spirit, thank you for coming into my heart and gifting me with power, love and self-control. Thank you for the unique gifts you have given me. Dwell in me and lead me every day. Teach me so that I will grow in maturity as a steward of those gifts and of the corner of the kingdom in which you have planted me.*

The Holy Spirit Is Here! Acts 2 : 14-41

The promised Holy Spirit had come, proof to the Jews that the promises God had made millennia before had been fulfilled in Jesus Christ (see Ac 2:36). Stewardship theologian T. A. Kantonen expounds on this defining moment in redemptive history...

The keynote of Pentecost is fulfillment. Fulfilled are prophecies of old, fulfilled is the saving purpose of God which Christ came to carry out. The rebellion against God has been crushed, the Messiah has triumphed. As the result of his victory the power of a new creation now flows into the world, a new age has begun under his lordship, a new humanity has been born of which he is the Head. This was the substance of Peter's sermon on Pentecost.

The role of the Holy Spirit is to point to the redemptive and restorative work of Jesus Christ. Stewardship theologian A. C. Conrad writes that...

so closely is the Spirit's work identified with that of the Son's that he is known thereafter as "the Spirit of the Lord" (Ac 5:9), "the Spirit of Jesus" (Ac 16:7), "the Spirit of Christ" (Ro 8:9), and "the Spirit of (God's) Son" (Gal 4:6). After Pentecost the Holy Spirit has a new and complete instrument of truth to deal with, (namely), the finished work of redemption through the Lord Jesus Christ. It is now his work to extend that redemption which ultimately will involve control over creation and the society of men.

Both Conrad and Kantonen discuss the implications this has for stewardship:

Kantonen says no one can be a Christian steward until the Holy Spirit has led him into the presence of the living Christ and a genuine personal commitment to Christ has taken place. Conversely, such a commitment cannot but lead to that vital wholehearted consecration which is the essence of stewardship.

And Conrad adds that in this glorious truth is to be found a basic principle of Christian stewardship. The Holy Spirit can administer the oikonomia of God only as he is permitted to sanctify, fill, and employ believers as stewards of God's grace, as Peter declares, "(Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms)" (1Pe 4:10). The characteristic thing of the apostolic church is the willingness of the believers to be so possessed by the Holy Spirit of God as to become such stewards.

MUSIC MINISTRY

Dear Church Family,

I love history and dates. When I first learned that in 2025 First Presbyterian Church of Mooresville would be celebrating its 150th birthday, I immediately began to think how this celebration could be honored through the music ministry. Many churches around the world commission a composer to write a special piece for their music ministry. Church anniversaries, honoring a director or pastor who is retiring, or honoring the deceased are a few reasons for commissioning a new piece. The music ministry has always been an important part of our church. Many of you know that Miriam McNeely was my relative, so I feel a deep personal connection to the church and the music ministry.

Lavinia Kell Parker and her husband Brad, a pianist, are dear friends of ours from our days living in Rochester, New York. Brad and I performed recitals together in New York and South Carolina, where he was a piano professor at Erskine College. Lavinia is a talented composer and music educator. Her use of improvisation with traditional compositional elements has garnered her the New Genre Award from the International Alliance of Women in Music, and top prizes in choral composition including from the ACCC, the New York Treble Singers, Vancouver Bach Choir, and the Ruth Watson Henderson Choral Composition Competition. Her choral works have been performed by elite choirs internationally and over the airwaves with CBC radio and PBS television. An educator of over 20 years, she has focused on bringing the joy of music to children and is the founder of Coulee Composers, a composition club for children in southern Alberta. Lavinia is an Associate Composer of the Canadian Music Centre and an Instructor at the University of Lethbridge Conservatory of Music.

For our special joint service on November 9th, Lavinia and I choose Psalm 150 as the perfect way to celebrate all the Lord has done and continues to do through this church. *Let Everything That Has Breath Praise the Lord* is an exclamation that our chief duty as creation is to praise and worship God our creator. We are to praise God, not only in His church, but everywhere on earth. We are to praise God, not only for His mighty deeds, but also for His excellent greatness. We are to praise God with many different instruments, voices, organs, pianos, drums, guitars, etc. We are to praise God with our whole lives. We are to be in a constant state of worshipping and praising God, not just at church.

This special piece was written for our Chancel Choir to sing, and was composed with their strengths in mind. The use of beautiful lyrical melodies, and strong four part harmonies highlight the talent and skill of the choir.

I look forward to seeing you all on November 9th as we celebrate what the Lord has done and continues to do at First Presbyterian Church of Mooresville.
