PASTOR'S LETTER

"God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though the waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging."

Psalms 46:1-3

I will keep this article concise and to the point. Yes, this is a crazy time in our culture. We are experiencing the angst of a global pandemic in the midst of an election year. All of the hotbed issues are at play- feelings, theories, and convictions related to health, race relations, social distancing, Supreme Court justice nominations, climate change, etc. Not to minimize any of these topics, but please step back and recognize this- God is still in control! John Calvin put it this way: "When [faith]... has learned that He is the Creator of all things, it should immediately conclude that He is also their perpetual governor and preserver ... All the parts of the world are quickened by the secret inspiration of God" (Calvin, *Institutes*, Lxvi.1). John Jefferson Davis, one of my theology professors from seminary, states "Providence is that sovereign activity of God whereby He sustains, preserves, and governs all His creatures, and guides all events toward their appointed ends... By the providence of God all events of nature and history are directed toward the fulfillment of His eternal plan of salvation."

All this to say, hang in there! It is certainly appropriate to take seriously and engage with the issues of our day. However, do so with a Christ-like mindset and do so trusting that God is completely in control. As Jesus said, "Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?"

Suffering Stewards- 1 Peter 3:8-22

For some reason we have come to think of God as the God of Prevention. A kind of firewall that stands between us and life's flames. But is it just possible that we are looking for God in all the wrong places? Is it just possible that while we are overly occupied with securing our bodies, relationships, and lifestyles, God is at work growing his eternal life within us?

We are to be good stewards of the physical/temporal realm, yes, but we are never to depend on it for our security. We are to give our very best to our marriages, our jobs, our children, our health, and our earth, but never with the idea in mind that - in so doing - we buy an unassailable life. What we do buy in our efforts is strength of character to face the stuff of life from which no one is exempt and a front row seat in the unfolding drama of God's redemptive work.

Yes, God sometimes protects, blesses, and speaks in dramatic ways. But these aspects of our life in God pale in comparison to other characteristics of God's kingdom that are anything but dramatic. Training our ears on God's voice and our eyes on his face- even when it seems there is no one speaking and no face to be found- is by far the greater miracle, the greatest evidence of God's life in us. This is truly imaginative faith...

Evidence of God's presence refuses to be collected and trophied like shells from the seashore. We encounter him most certainly in the steady, unfolding redemption of our life's everyday circumstances.
