## PASTOR'S LETTER

"His master replied, 'Well done, good and faithful servant... Come and share your master's happiness!' – Matthew 25:21

Dear Church Family,

It is sometimes good to step back and reflect on the blessings the Lord has placed in our lives. Just this past week my uncle, John Huffman, took his final earthly breath and entered into God's Kingdom. He was a man larger than life! At age 20 he led his first Holy Land trip with Norman



Vincent Peale. He went on to lead an additional 36 Holy Land trips! At age 29, he was the lead pastor of a Presbyterian church at which President Richard Nixon attended thirteen times. During his pastoral years of ministry, he was also chaplain for the Miami Dolphins, Pittsburgh Steelers, and the Senior PGA tour (western region). He chaired numerous boards for prominent evangelical organizations, including World Vision, Christianity Today, and Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary.

I had the privilege of serving on staff with John for a decade at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church of Newport Beach, CA. This was a church of 4,500 in which he served for almost four decades. I was also blessed to experience with him my first Holy Land trip which was the last Holy Land trip that he ever led!

What stood out to me most in John's ministry was his leadership, integrity, grace, and compassion. He was a type A leader! (Double A) He made it clear that anyone who served on staff with him needed to be on top of things in their own area of ministry. He was not there to micromanage or hold anyone by the hand. He led by example. John was the same person at church as he was at home, in the community, or at the golf course. I witnessed his integrity and grace by the way he held to his convictions in a very diverse denomination, yet treated those on the opposite side of theological division with genuine respect.

He also showed tremendous compassion and grace to those on his staff who at times may have undermined him or given him a tough time. He never used his influence or power to hurt those that may have hurt him. The most noteworthy part of his ministry in my mind was the powerful connection he made with people around the world who had lost a child. This came from a deep place in that he lost his oldest daughter, Suzanne, to Hodgkin's disease at age 21.





What I loved the most about my uncle John was his love for family. I have vivid memories of family vacations going all back to my toddler years. He was always larger than life! (6'4") He was always loud! He could be intense, yet he was also fun, engaging, and genuinely enjoyed being with family. As a nephew, I was blessed to get a visit from my uncle in numerous settings- Lake Wales, FL, Wheaton, IL, Quincy, Ma, Litchfield, CT, and right here in Mooresville. He invited me to attend board meetings, he would offer to preach in each of my settings, and he would often spend the night at our home and engage with my six daughters who also viewed him as larger than life!

As I reflect on the life of my uncle, I feel tremendously blessed to have been gifted with a person who has impacted me as a nephew, pastor, husband, father, and friend. Rest in peace Uncle John!!

It continues to be a privilege to serve alongside you in ministry!

## JUST A THOUGHT...

#### Just a Thought: Grasping the Love of Christ

In Ephesians 3, the apostle Paul offers one of the most breathtaking prayers in the New Testament. He kneels before the Father and prays that believers would be strengthened in their inner being by the Spirit, so that Christ may dwell in their hearts through faith. His longing is that we would have the power "to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that [we] may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God" (Ephesians 3:18–19).

What strikes me is that Paul doesn't pray for the church to be more productive, more disciplined, or more impressive. Instead, he prays that we would be strong enough to slow down, to become rooted in love, and to comprehend the incomprehensible: the love of Christ.

#### Power, Reimagined in Christ

When Paul speaks of power, he isn't talking about power to rule, conquer, or dominate. Christ has already done the conquering—He defeated sin and death on the cross. The power we need today is different. It is the power to become humble, to rest in God's love, and to let go of striving. It is the power to resist the lie that God's approval depends on our performance. It is the power to pause long enough to remember: "Yes, Jesus loves me, the Bible tells me so." This is the upside-down way of Jesus. In a world that seeks control and strength, Christ calls us to a deeper strength—the strength to forgive, the strength to trust, the strength to walk in grace. This is not weakness. It is Spirit-given power to know that we are loved and to live from that love.

#### How Do We Grasp Christ's Love?

Paul's prayer reminds us that none of us can grasp the love of God on our own. But we can place ourselves in the posture to receive it. We grasp it by opening Scripture and letting the Word remind us again and again of God's mercy. We grasp it in prayer, not rushing to fill the silence, but pausing

long enough to let God's Spirit speak peace over us. We grasp it in community, as we encourage one another and remind each other of the truth that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

It takes power to slow down. It takes power to resist the distractions that shrink our vision of God. And it takes power to lift our eyes from ourselves and behold a love that is wider, longer, higher, and deeper than we can measure.

So, let us join Paul's prayer for one another: that God would strengthen us by His Spirit so that we may truly know the love of Christ. And as we grasp even a fraction of that immeasurable love, may our lives and our church overflow with it—united, renewed, and rooted in Him. "Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine... to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen." (Ephesians 3:20–21)

Reflection: Ways to Practice Grasping Christ's Love This Week

- Pray Paul's Prayer Daily Read Ephesians 3:14–21 each morning, asking God to help you comprehend His love in a fresh way.
- Practice Rest Set aside ten minutes of silence each day to simply sit in God's presence, without an agenda, remembering that His love is not earned but given.
- Share the Love Encourage someone this week by reminding them of God's love. A text, a note, or a prayer can help them grasp what you are also learning.

PRAYER: Lord, thank you for your call on my life. I want to follow you.

Follow Me: Mark 2:13-17

It was only a few words, yet the man left the tax booth immediately. Mark records no conversation, no preaching, no confession of faith, but the response is as abrupt as that of Simon and Andrew as they left their nets (Mk 1:14-20). Why? Theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer says that...the cause behind the immediate following of call by response is Jesus Christ himself. It is Jesus who calls, and because it is Jesus, Levi follows at once. This encounter is a testimony to the absolute, direct, and unaccountable authority of Jesus. There is no need of any preliminaries, and no other consequence but obedience to the call. Because Jesus is the Christ, he has the authority to call and to demand obedience to his word. Jesus summons men to follow him not as a teacher or a pattern of the good life, but as the Christ, the Son of God. In this short text Jesus Christ and his claim are proclaimed to men. Not a word of praise is given to the disciple for his decision for Christ. We are not expected to contemplate the disciple, but only him who calls, and his absolute authority. According to our text, there is no road to faith or discipleship, no other road – only obedience to the call of Jesus. So began a new life in every sense of the word for Levi. He simply left his old life and followed this teacher – abandoning home, work and security but moving toward a life of "infinite possibilities" and "significance."

Bonhoeffer elaborates: Besides Jesus nothing has any significance. He alone matters. When we are called to follow Christ, we are summoned to an exclusive attachment to his person. The grace of his call bursts all the bonds of legalism. It is a gracious call, a gracious commandment. It transcends the difference between the law and the gospel. Christ calls, the disciple follows; that is grace and commandment in one. "(I will walk about in freedom, for I have sought out your precepts)" (Ps 119:45).

Philosophy professor, speaker and discipleship author Dallas Willard takes a similar view on the call of discipleship: "The vast grim 'cost of discipleship' is something we hear constantly emphasized." However, heeding the call is incomparable to the cost of ignoring Jesus' call to take on his "easy yoke" (Mt 11:29-30). Willard says that "to depart from righteousness is to choose a life of crushing burdens, failures, and disappointments, a life caught in the toils of endless problems that are never resolved. Here is the source of the unending soap opera, that sometimes horror show known as normal human life."

When the choice is posed in such terms, what can one do but join with Simon Peter in saying, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We believe and know that you are the Holy One of God" (Jn 6:68-69).


