#### **Ushering Volunteers Needed!**

Ushering provides an important function in the life of our church, ensuring that congregants have their needs attended. During the COVID pandemic, only Head Ushering duties were maintained, via service of a small group of volunteers. Now that the church is returning to normal, both services will be adding additional ushering support starting Sunday, September 11. As a result we are looking for volunteers. We are targeting 7 ushers per month, as follows:

143 Broad: 1 Head Usher and 1 additional usher
Traditional Service: 1 Head Usher, 1 Assistant Head Usher, 2 greeters, and 2 additional ushers

Based on these targets, we need approximately 50 additional volunteers. Each usher will serve for one month, assisting the designated Head Usher. Written instructions will be provided, and a short training (~30 mins) will be offered after the Traditional Service on August 21.

#### **Opportunity for Mission Partnership**

In the midst of global uncertainty, the Presbyterian Church of Egypt is hard at work and passionate about sharing the Good News! They are planting churches and revitalizing congregations that have been faithful for well over a hundred years. Of the 450 congregations which are a part of the Synod of the Nile (est. 1854), 25% were planted in the last 10 years – this is a movement with energy and vision!

A small team of four from FPC will be heading to experience the Egyptian church and see what the Lord is doing. We would love to have you join us. The team, led by Marilyn Borst, The Outreach Foundation's Associate Director for Partnership Development, will take us to visit some of these initiatives and see how God is working through His people. We will experience exciting new church developments along with vibrant, existing congregations and explore possibilities for establishing ongoing church-to-church partnerships for individual congregations. We will spend inspiring time with the staff and students at the Evangelical Theological Seminary in Cairo which is training the next generation of leadership to expand Christ's Kingdom in the Middle East. After five days in Cairo (which includes a visit to the Pyramids, of course) we will fly down to Aswan to be encouraged by the ministries of the Synod in its southern-most Presbytery and spend a day at the spectacular UNECSO World Heritage site of Abu Simbel, the rock-cut temples of Ramses the Great.

In this new "covid age," we will make every effort to stay safe and healthy. Our accommodations will be in first-class hotels. Our trusted travel agent in Egypt will make sure that our minibus is cleaned daily and will arrange for any necessary PCR tests. As required by a decision of Outreach's trustees, all travelers must be fully vaccinated. Land cost: \$2,795 which includes hotel (double occupancy), transportation, most meals, transfers, touring, visa upon arrival, and in-country airfare between Cairo and Aswan. Price does not include international airfare and PCR tests if required upon departure. For more information, contact Pastor Jason at jason@mooresvillefpc.org or call the church office.

#### **Opportunity for Mission Partnership**

Almost all of the Jorai people (approximately ½ million folks) of North Vietnam and Cambodia live in poverty. Although the literacy rate is fairly low there, we can't think of a better way to learn to read than through the Word of God! The Jorai Bible Association is trying very hard to distribute Bibles to their people. (The Wycliffe Foundation has helped with this ministry.) The Mission Committee would like to challenge you to help with this endeavor. Each Bible costs just \$5. Your Mission Committee has agreed to help, but we would like to challenge/offer you the opportunity to help with this project. For the entire month of August, donations will be accepted in any amount. There will be special envelopes available at the back of the sanctuary as well as in the pews and in the 143 Building. Personal checks with the "Jorai Bibles" in the memo portion of your check will also be accepted. Please prayerfully consider this opportunity.

We are looking foreward to another wonderful year with our Logos/Middle School Ministry (MSM) program. We have had a Logos program at First Presbyterian since Fall 1979, and are grateful to build on this long-lasting program.

Logos/MSM is a mid-week program for children and youth in 1st – 8th grades. The goal of the program is the same as it was in 1979 – to develop genuine and lasting relationships between young people and Jesus Christ, between young people and their ministers, parents and other adults in the congregation, and their peers.

- MSM is for Grades 6-8.
- The 4 parts of Logos/MSM are Bible study, recreation, worship skills and dinner hour.
- Logos/MSM meets on Wednesday afternoons from 4:30-7:00 pm.
- First day of Logos/MSM is Wednesday, September 14.
- Parents must attend a Parent meeting and volunteer in some capacity, usually in the kitchen (or have a volunteer "sponsor" your child).
- Registration deadline is Wednesday, September 7.
- Cost is \$35 registration fee; \$55 per semester tuition fee.



#### Handbells (11am service)


