# PASTOR'S LETTER

**“Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine...”**

**Ephesians 3:20**

Dear Church family,

Just this past Sunday, Nancy Decaron, executor of the Fronnie Garnder Foundation, made a formal announcement to our church at the 11:15am service. After years of faithfully managing the account, Nancy made a final gift of \$500,000 to FPC Mooresville- Fronnie's home church. Many of you remember Fronnie's heart. She loved the youth of this congregation. She loved Christian education. She loved missions. And for more than a decade, her foundation quietly strengthened the type of ministries that mattered deeply to her. Through her generosity, we've been able to support *Adventures in Faith*, supplement programs like LOGOS, and invest in leadership development and new member experiences. Her legacy has been woven into the life of this church for years.

The timing of this final gift is truly remarkable! As you know, we launched Phase I of our Legacy Campaign in December with an estimated project cost of \$1.85 million. Through your sacrificial giving, we have already received \$1.4 million in pledges. And now, with this unexpected and deeply meaningful gift from the Gardner Foundation, our total dedicated funds for Phase I stand at \$1.9 million. This is not the first time the Lord has surprised us in this manner. If you can recall, the Lord blessed us through the Johnston estates years back when we addressed the 143 building and the “refresh work” across our campus. It is a reminder that God's provision often arrives in ways we could never orchestrate — and always at the right time. It is also a reminder that the seeds planted by faithful saints continue to bear fruit long after their earthly work is done. We give thanks for Fronnie's life. We give thanks for Nancy's stewardship. And we give thanks for the God who continues to guide and sustain this church. In the coming weeks, we will share more about what this means for the next steps of our Legacy Campaign. For now, let us simply pause and give thanks for a gift that reflects both the generosity of a beloved member of our past and the hope of the ministry God is calling us into for the future.

It continues to be a blessing to serve alongside you in ministry!

# STEWARDSHIP

---

**GIVING YOUR TIME, YOUR TALENTS, AND YOUR TITHES TO GOD'S WORK...**

**PRAYER:** *Lord, thank you for your good creation. Help me to live in the world with discipline and balance in order to be a good steward of all you have entrusted to me.*

## **Stewards of God's Good Things - Colossians 2:16-23**

Paul is cautioning the Colossians not to stray from the gospel of freedom in Christ and not to listen to those who would submit them to the restraints of man-made religious rules. For example, Paul warns against asceticism (*see Col 2:21*), a renunciation of the material world that denies the body and holds that bodily pleasure is a source of sin.

For Christians today, as in Paul's day, the issue is complex. How does one live in the world and properly steward physical pleasures? The culture in the current Western world tends more toward hedonism rather than asceticism. Hedonism is the philosophy that people should deny themselves nothing because the material world is all there is.

The answer for Christians is balance. Neither extreme is acceptable nor Biblical. We can enjoy the good gifts of God, but we are to use them in ways that glorify God and that conform to Jesus' commands to love others and ourselves. But what does that look like, practically speaking? Determining where to draw the line between the righteous use of God's good gifts and greedy overindulgence can be difficult and is, ultimately, a matter of conscience. Too much of our perverted use of food, drink, sex, leisure, hobbies or anything can lead us into sin, harm our bodies and obscure our sense of the presence of God. There are good reasons to prayerfully discipline ourselves and limit our consumption of resources. For our physical and spiritual growth, for the good of the kingdom of God, and for the benefit of others, it's often advantageous to call enough, enough. Knowing when to do so is an act of freedom in Christ. Reformer John Calvin (1509-1564) suggests the following:

Let this be our principle: that the use of God's gifts is not wrongly directed when it is referred to that end to which the Author himself created and destined them for us, since he created them for our good, not for our ruin. Accordingly, no one will hold to a straighter path than he who diligently looks to this end. Now if we ponder to what end God created food, we shall find that he meant not only to provide for necessity but also for delight and good cheer. Thus, the purpose of clothing, apart from necessity, was comeliness and decency. In grasses, trees, and fruits, apart from their various uses, there is beauty of appearance and pleasantness of odor (*Genesis 2:9*). For if this were not true, the prophet would not have reckoned them among the benefits of God, "(wine that gladdens the heart of man, oil to make his face shine)" (*Ps 104:15*). Scripture would not have reminded us repeatedly in commending his kindness, that he gave all such things to men. And the natural qualities themselves of things demonstrate sufficiently to what end and intent we may enjoy them ... What? Did he not so distinguish colors as to make some more lovely than others? What? Did he not endow gold and silver, ivory and marble, with a loveliness that renders them more precious than other metals or stones? Did he not, in short, render many things attractive to us, apart from their necessary use?

# JUST A THOUGHT...

## From the Mountain into the People (Acts 2:1-4)

One of these days I was studying up to prepare a lesson for the theology class for WNT that recently ended. There's a thought that stuck with me that I thought I might share here: You know Pentecost? Acts 2? When the day of Pentecost arrived, the disciples were gathered together in the upper room. And suddenly, it's like heaven broke in. A *sound* like a mighty rushing wind *filled* the house. Tongues of *fire* appeared and *separated*, coming to *rest* on each of them. And they were all *filled* with the Holy Spirit.

This is not random imagery. The italics should be giving you some big hints. For those who know the story of Scripture, this moment echoes everything God had been doing from the beginning of the story. Think of the key words here: Noise. Wind. Fire. Filling. What do they point to? These are the signs of God's presence.

At Mount Sinai, in Exodus 19, God descended in fire and smoke, and the mountain trembled under the weight of His glory. In the wilderness, He led His people as a pillar of cloud by day and fire by night. And when the tabernacle was completed, we are told that "the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the LORD *filled* the tabernacle"... and that the cloud *rested* upon it (Exodus 40:34-35). That's where heaven and earth met... on a mountain, in a tent; a specific place where God's presence dwelled among His people.

But at Pentecost, something changes... The fire is no longer centralized. What that means is we don't see a single pillar, not confined to one location. Luke tells us it *separates* and comes to rest on *each* of them. And not just a few, the Spirit fills *all* of them. Translation: The presence of God is no longer limited to a place – it is given to a people.

Actually, not just given – what once filled the tabernacle now fills people; the Spirit of God fills human hearts! What once rested on a structure now rests on believers. The same glory, the same holiness, the same purifying fire of God is now poured out and given through the Holy Spirit into humanity.

This is what Jesus had promised: that God would not only be *with* His people, but *in* them. Pentecost is not just about power or even about tongues, though that is important, it is about *presence*. God has made His dwelling with us. And that means something deeply personal for us today. We, on this side of the cross and history, are not waiting for God to show up in a cloud or descend on a mountain. Through the Holy Spirit, His presence is already here; resting on us, filling us, leading us under the banner of Christ. The question is not whether God is near. The question is whether we are living aware that His presence now dwells within us.

Today, wherever you find yourself, (at work, at home, in the quiet or in the chaos), remember this: the same presence that once filled Sinai and the tabernacle now rests on you. You are not alone or empty. The Spirit of God dwells within you and is raising you to new life again and again, because the Life is living within us.

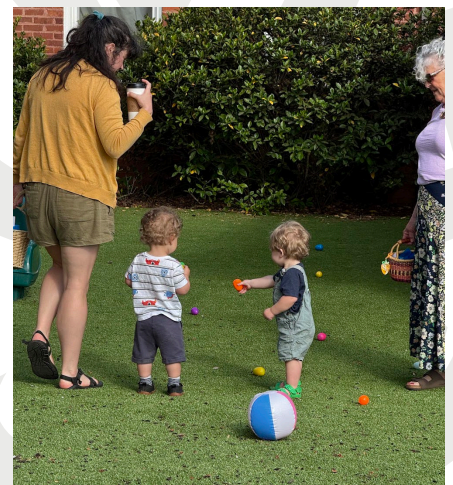
### May 17 - Church Picnic

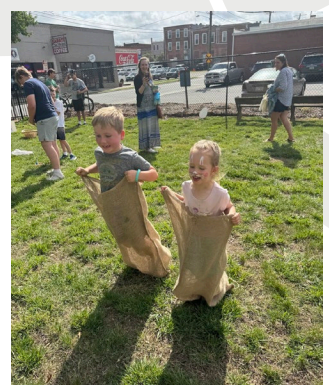
