## Bio for Emmanuel Abdullah Muhammed

Emmanuel Muhammed was born into a royal Islamic family in Nigeria. He grew up in a palace with his father serving as Emir of an Emirate in Northern Nigerian. The family owned vast oil wells but also played influential leadership roles in the flourishing of Islam in their caliphate. Emmanuel himself had memorized the entire Koran by age 11.

As Crown Prince, Emmanuel was sent to the best universities in Cairo, Egypt earning two M.A.s in Islamic studies and eventually a Ph.D. in Islamic Law in Saudi Arabia. On the completion of his studies, Emmanuel was appointed to a professorship at the University of Medina in Saudi Arabia where many of his students were training to become Imams.



It was at this point that Emmanuel experienced several dreams with a “white figure” chiding him for “misleading my people,” and instructing him to purchase a Bible and read the Gospel of John. Through a series of miraculous events, Emmanuel decided to follow Jesus. This resulted in his torture and imprisonment, along with the loss of his academic position, extended family, personal wealth and future coronation.

Following Emmanuel’s escape from prison he met and married Grace, a Christian woman from Southern Nigeria. They fled to South Africa for a season where Muslims began coming to Emmanuel to hear his story. As an Islamic scholar, Emmanuel felt far less equipped to explain Christian Scripture and theology and eventually applied for a seminary scholarship to Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary in Boston, MA. Emmanuel studied for a Master of Divinity at GCTS while Grace earned a degree in Spiritual Formation.

Upon graduation, the Muhammed’s returned to Nigeria not knowing exactly how their future ministry might evolve. They have been overwhelmed by the response to their teaching ministry with study centers now established in Jos and in the capital city of Abuja. Most amazing has been the response to Emmanuel’s dangerous trips to Northern Nigeria where the Islamic terrorist group Boko Haram is active.

In just five years since their return, over 6,000 Muslims in Northern Nigeria have decided to follow Jesus with many having lost their homes, families, and employment as a result. Every year a heartbreaking number of new converts are also imprisoned and even martyred for their faith.

Emmanuel and Grace will be returning to the United States in Spring 2025 to visit friends and churches here. Emmanuel will be sharing his story and details about Hebron Home’s current ministry at FPC Mooresville on May 4th, 2025. This experience will include dinner at 5:30pm in the Fellowship Hall followed by a worship service in the sanctuary at 6:30pm.

**It is Finished** - Mark 15:33-39

And with Jesus’ last cry, redemptive history reached a watershed. Jesus said, “It is finished” (*John 19:20*). Jesus had fulfilled God’s plan that the Father had “purposed in Christ, to be put into effect when the times will have reached their fulfillment- to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ” (*Ephesians 1:9-10*). The essence and heart of

God’s purpose is revealed in the redemptive work of Christ. In his death Jesus became the great high priest, fulfilling all the requirements of the old law, interceding between God and humans “once and for all when he offered himself” (*Hebrews 7:27*).

Those who accept the gospel of forgiveness in faith receive the power to become not only God’s trustees but also his children. The motive for their action is grateful love; the more lovingly we know him who loved us and gave himself for us the more completely we give ourselves to him. And because genuine love is “not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth” (*1 John 3:18*), we shoulder the responsibilities of Christian stewardship.

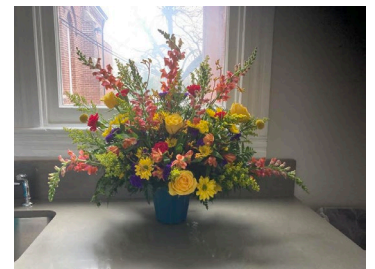
## Easter Prayer Vigil

## MAUNDY THURSDAY, APRIL 17

On Thursday, April 17 the chancel choir, orchestra, and Debra Hall Williams will present Michael John Trotta's **Seven Last Words** in the sanctuary at 7:00pm. This recent composition which premiered in 2016 has become a deeply powerful and meaningful work for Holy Week. Many of you will remember the meaningful performance last year on Maundy Thursday. Please plan to attend and invite friends. Below is a description of the work from the publisher...

Haunting and evocative, the work displays a superb sense of form and architecture, poignantly distilling the most intimate and universal moments of human emotion. From the tender mercy of "Father, Forgive Them" (1) to the hopefulness of the promise of "Today You Will Be With Me" (2), the work unfolds to reveal a complex tapestry of states of emotion. It builds from the compassion of "Behold, Your Son" (3) and the yearning of "I Thirst" (4), to the despair of "My God Why Have You Abandoned Me?" (5), the acceptance of "Into Your Hands I Surrender" (6), and finally the resignation of "It is Finished" (7). This setting uses various interpolations of biblical and liturgical texts (e.g. Kyrie, "Truly This Man Was the Son of God," "All of the Gates Were Opened Wide") as commentary on, and in dialogue with, the words of Christ, further expanding the story and the reaction of those witnesses to the Passion.

## WEDNESDAY, APRIL 30

Our 4th-12th graders will be performing a musical, **Word Power** on Wednesday, April 30 at 6:30pm in the 143 worship space. This performance will mark our last Wednesday Night Together and will be preceded by our normal meal at 5:30 in the Fellowship Hall. Everyone is invited to this brief (40 minute) musical performance. The children have learned music, choreography, acting, and basic stage production, but most importantly according to the Bible how their words have power for good or evil.

*It's Presentation Day at school, and Nellie is petrified to speak. The class has been studying what the Bible says about the power of our words. It's time for these classroom characters to share what they've learned. Each "Student Presentation" is based on their assigned scripture verse. How will Nellie navigate her fear, make decisions about confidentiality, and discover support from an unlikely ally?*

## CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

April - This month we have so many wonderful things going on! We are in our last month of WNT with a drama performance by our 4th-12th graders on April 30th. We hope you will join us for dinner at 5:30pm followed by the worship night of the children's performance.

## SUMMER HELP NEEDED:

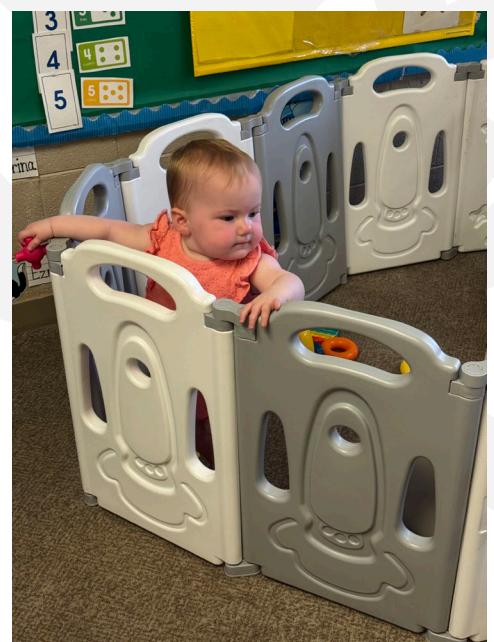
