ABOUT US



Early childhood is a foundational period of development—shaping emotional well-being, resilience, and lifelong outcomes. In recent years, the State of Georgia has taken important strides to address the social and emotional needs of its youngest residents.

In 2019, under the leadership of Chairwoman Katie Dempsey, the Georgia House of Representatives established a study committee focused on the early identification and prevention of mental health concerns in infants and toddlers. The committee emphasized the importance of supporting the critical social and emotional development that occurs during a child's earliest years and issued key recommendations for building a comprehensive, coordinated system of care for young children, their families, and the professionals who serve them.

In response to this momentum—and through the efforts of the Infant-Toddler Coalition convened by the Georgia Early Education Alliance for Ready Students (GEEARS) and other committed partners—the Georgia Association for Infant Mental Health: Birth to Five (GA-AIMH) was founded. GA-AIMH serves as a statewide hub to elevate the importance of infant and early childhood mental health (IECMH), support and strengthen the IECMH workforce, and promote cross-sector collaboration to advance the emotional well-being of young children and their families across Georgia.

Our mission is to promote family, infant and early childhood mental health as foundational to development.

Our vision is for all of Georgia's infants and young children to be safe and nurtured through consistent, caregiving relationships in order to reach their fullest potential.
