## Types of Families

- Nuclear Family- Families with a traditional structure that includes two parents and children.
- ☐ Single Parent Family-Families with one parent raising one or more children alone.
- Extended Family-Consists two or more adults who live together, this can include cousins, grandparents, aunts and uncles.
- ☐ Blended Families-These families are created when two separate families merge into one.

#### Relationships between Families and Staff

- ✓ are fueled by families' passion for their children
- ✓ are based on mutual respect and trust, affirm and celebrate families' cultures
- ✓ provide opportunities fir two-way communication
- ✓ Include authentic interactions that are meaningful to those who participate in them
- ✓ Require an awareness of one's personal biases and how those biases can affect mutual respect and trust

## Strengths Based Attitudes for Building Positive Goal Oriented Relationships with Families

- Families are the first and most important teachers of their children.
- ☐ Families are our partners with a critical role in their child's development.
- ☐ Families have expertise about their child and their family.
- ☐ Families' contributions are important and valuable.

## Encourage Positive Family-Staff Relationships

- Provide opportunities for family participation.
- ☐ Accept parents without judging them.
- ☐ Trust that parents are the experts with their own children.
- ☐ Treat parents as individuals and call them by name.
- Offer positive feedback and encouragement to families.
- ☐ Keep parents informed.
- Respond to requests for information to the best of your ability.
- ☐ Encourage parents to talk to you about their children.

# Barriers to Positive Family-Teacher Partnerships

- > Differences in backgrounds- could be culture, language or socio economic
- > Stress
- ➤ Differing Values
- ➤ Differences in viewing roles
- > Types of experiences (Positive/Negative)
- ➤ Communication Abilities
- Need to feel valued
