Dear Loyal Guest,

It is my pleasure to introduce an additional series of sailings to our highly awaited Cuba Inaugural Voyages.

As some of you may know, I arrived in the United States on the day of my seventh birthday and spent my early school years in New Britain, Connecticut. Throughout our nine years there, our family proudly preserved most Cuban traditions, as my parents insisted that my younger brother and I speak Spanish at home and that our family have dinner together each night, usually with typical Cuban cuisine – black beans and rice, ropa vieja, fricasé de pollo or masitas de puerco and my favorite dessert, casquitos de guayaba con queso crema (guava in heavy syrup with cream cheese). Of course, since many Cuban ingredients were not available in Connecticut, we waited for the 1960s version of Amazon – the postman – with great anticipation each month, for a delivery of goodies mailed by friends from Miami.

Many nights, my brother, baby sister and I would listen to my parents reminisce about their fond recollection of days in Havana. My mother would describe the mild ocean breezes that drifted through the streets of Havana near the Malecón where she lived until marrying my father. She recalls how she and her friends would play on the rooftop under the bright blue sky while her parents and grandparents sat on the wide terrace below.

The front porch was always the most popular room in the house, a place where family and friends gathered, enjoyed fresh air and watched the goings-on in the street. My father spoke of the incredible beaches and the bountiful fishing, of the famous landmarks that made Havana the place to be in the 1950s, and the yearnings he had to see that beautiful place called home again. My parents told us of the evenings when they would get dressed up, have dinner at a seaside

restaurant (their favorite dish was enchilado de langosta, lobster in creole sauce) and then go dancing at Tropicana, topped off by a romantic stroll along the Malecón.

Returning to Havana has been an exciting experience for me – to walk the streets my parents used to walk and see our home in the Havana suburb of Lawton where we lived, the school I attended and the various neighborhoods in which all of my relatives lived. I look forward to the possibility of finding some of my parents' old friends and reconnecting with family that stayed behind, my Aunt Elda and cousins, George and Luis.

My wife, Marcia, and her family are also from Cuba – Camagüey, a province east of Havana. Today our large family gatherings in Miami are filled with lively Cuban music, the same traditional dishes (although the grandkids prefer burgers and pizza), loud laughter, stories, lots of Cuban advice (wanted and unwanted) and of course, the occasional game of dominoes. The only “Cuban” thing we don’t do is smoke cigars! Marcia, my two children, my four grandchildren and I are excited to be fulfilling this once thought unattainable dream of sailing into Havana harbor on an Oceania Cruises voyage. And I’m eager to discover new areas of Cuba along with you. I have heard wonderful and interesting things about Cienfuegos and Santiago de Cuba – places I’ve never visited, but you now have the opportunity to on these new voyages.

I couldn’t be happier to share with you the excitement and passion that cruising to Cuba symbolizes for my family and me, and for all of us at Oceania Cruises.

I warmly invite you to join us on one of these special journeys to Cuba aboard *Insignia* this coming autumn.

Visit Havana's massive Plaza de la Revolución, an important symbol of Cuban history that has been the site of political rallies since the Revolution of 1959 and is also home to the José Martí memorial and museum



CIENFUEGOS - THE PEARL OF THE SOUTH

Situated in a beautiful bay in the heart of Cuba's fertile agricultural region on the southern coast, Cienfuegos will quietly charm you with its French spirit, tranquil seaside setting and neoclassical architecture. Known as La Perla del Sur (the Pearl of the South), Cienfuegos was originally founded by French settlers and is recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage site. Rich in educationally engaging diversions, its historic center features well-preserved 19th-century structures, gorgeous plazas and a layout inspired by the Spanish Enlightenment. Stop at the notable Catedral de la Purísima Concepción, step back in time at Teatro Terry and go for a leisurely stroll along the picturesque bay.



HIGHLIGHTS

While in Cienfuegos, travel to nearby Trinidad's UNESCO World Heritage-listed Valle de los Ingenios, a living museum of Cuban sugar production with a multitude of 19th-century sugar cane mills and plantation houses

From Cienfuegos, visit the birthplace of famed musician Benny Moré, Cuba's Frank Sinatra, in the nearby hamlet of Santa Isabel de las Lajas



SANTIAGO THE CUBA - CULTURAL PARADISE

A tropical and energetic cultural epicenter, Santiago de Cuba is the country's second largest city and has played an instrumental role in the evolution of Cuban music, literature and architecture. Wedged between the looming Sierra Maestra mountain range and the aquamarine Caribbean Sea, the city offers a plethora of rich heritage and cultural diversions amidst a dramatic backdrop. Discover the city's fascinating history at Castillo de San Pedro de la Roca and the Cementerio Santa Ifigenia, where Cuban hero José Martí and Emilio Bacardí Moreau of the famed rum dynasty are both buried. Countless musicians have emerged from Santiago de Cuba including Miguel Matamoros of Trío Matamoros and Sindo Garay, and many say the heart of this thriving city lives in its music scene. Don't miss the chance to learn about and experience the roots of Cuban music and dance such as the rumba, mambo and cha cha cha at a local theater or dance club.



HIGHLIGHTS

Attend a performance at Santiago de Cuba's Casa de la Trova, home of the renowned trova style of music which fuses African rhythms with Spanish guitar

Visit the Castillo de San Pedro de la Roca, a looming fortress that once protected the city from pirates and is now designated a UNESCO World Heritage site for its architectural and historical significance





OCEANIA CRUISES IN CUBA

How can Oceania Cruises offer voyages to Cuba?

Under regulations set forth by the U.S. Department of the Treasury, Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC), Oceania Cruises may offer carrier services by vessel to authorized travelers, directly or indirectly, between the United States and Cuba (OFAC FAQ # 24 and 31 CFR § 515.572).

How does a Cuba voyage differ from other voyages Oceania Cruises offers?

Oceania Cruises is offering voyages to Cuba that comply with OFAC regulations for people to people exchanges. However, all of the extraordinary elements of an Oceania Cruises voyage including The Finest Cuisine at Sea™, an intimately luxurious ambiance and impeccable personalized service are included.

What is a people-to-people exchange?

An individual traveler may travel to Cuba under the people-to-people authorized travel category, as a self-certified traveler, so long as he/she maintains a full-time schedule of educational exchange activities intended to enhance contact with the Cuban people and that will result in meaningful interaction between the traveler and individuals in Cuba.

REQUIREMENTS FOR TRAVELERS

Is it legal for U.S. citizens to travel to Cuba?

Yes. OFAC regulates travel to Cuba pursuant to the Helms-Burton Act and other pertinent regulations. Currently, there are 12 categories of authorized travel to Cuba.

People-to-people travel is one of the ways for Americans to visit Cuba and gives you an opportunity to discover Cuba through its people and from a local perspective. All guests will be required to self-certify that their activities meet the requirements above, so you must retain records of your activities whether or not they are offered by Oceania Cruises for a period

of 5 years. For additional information on people-to-people exchanges, please refer to FAQ "What is a people-to-people exchange?"

Do I need a passport to travel to Cuba?

Yes. A valid passport is required for all guests to travel to Cuba. We recommend guests review the passport requirements of travel to Cuba from their home country and that the expiration of your passport be greater than six months from the date of your voyage.

How do I certify that I am travelling under one of the OFAC-approved categories of travel?

All guests must complete a certification form which sets forth and confirms that they will be participating in OFAC-compliant activities. Please visit our website OceaniaCruises.com and follow link for the certification form. A completed certification form for each guest may be sent by email to SpecialServices@oceaniacruises.com or turned in at the time of embarkation. Please be advised that guests will not be able to board the vessel without having first completed this form.

All guests will be self-certifying which means that they are solely responsible for arranging a full-time schedule of OFAC-compliant activities, as explained above. These activities may include excursions provided by Oceania Cruises or activities arranged by guests themselves.

How do I prove compliance with OFAC requirements during my cruise?

All travelers to Cuba must be able to prove that their trip was comprised of OFAC-compliant activities. Guests should keep a log of their activities and keep the log for 5 years.

Will non-U.S. guests be allowed to travel on these sailings?

Yes. As with travelers from the United States, non-U.S. guests will need to certify that they are traveling under one of the approved OFAC categories, keep records of their activities and sign affidavits confirming they are doing so.

VISA CONSIDERATIONS

Do I need a visa to travel to Cuba?

The Cuban government requires anyone who is traveling to Cuba on a passport other than a valid Cuban passport to obtain a visa prior to their arrival into Cuba. For all visitors who were not born in Cuba, this visa, also known as a "tourist card" (or "rosada" which must have a pink and blue background irrespective of your country of residency), is required to enter (and depart from) Cuba for non-business purposes. This visa is valid for a single entry and allows the holder to stay in Cuba for 30 days. You may obtain this visa through Oceania Cruises for a separate processing and procurement fee of \$75 or on your own. Please note that you will not be allowed to board the vessel without proof of acquiring this visa.

The Cuban visa is a two-part card. Cuban immigration officials will take one half upon arrival in Cuba, and guests will surrender the other half to Cuban immigration officials upon departure. Guests should be sure to keep the Cuban visa in a safe place during the trip so they have it at the time of departure from Cuba.

REQUIREMENTS FOR TRAVELERS BORN IN CUBA:

Guests born in Cuba who emigrated before January 1, 1971 and reside in a country outside of Cuba are required to carry either (i) a valid Cuban passport or (ii) a valid passport from your country of citizenship along with an HE-11 visa obtained from the Cuban embassy or consulate in your country of residency (except in those cases where such country has entered into a visa exemption agreement with Cuba) for entry to and departure from Cuba. The estimated processing time for an HE-11 visa is up to 60 days.

Guests born in Cuba who emigrated on or after January 1, 1971 and reside in a country outside of Cuba are required to carry a valid Cuban passport for entry to and departure from Cuba. These guests do not need a Cuban visa. The estimated processing time for a Cuban passport is up to 6 months.

Guests born in Cuba who require a visa or passport should contact the Cuban embassy or consulate in their country of residency. Those residing in the United States may contact the Cuban Embassy in Washington, DC:

The website of the US Embassy in Cuba (<http://havana.usembassy.gov/service.html>) states that U.S. citizens who are Cuban-born will be treated in Cuba solely as Cuban citizens and the Cuban government may require these individuals to enter and depart Cuba using a Cuban passport. Using a Cuban passport for this purpose does not jeopardize one's U.S. citizenship; however, such persons must use their U.S. passports to enter and depart the United States. Citizens of countries other than the United States should check with their embassies in Cuba for regulations pertaining to their citizenship and use of passports.

PRACTICAL CONSIDERATIONS WHILE IN CUBA

Are there restrictions on what I can bring into Cuba?

There are both U.S. and Cuba import regulations that travelers must comply with when traveling and bringing items into Cuba.

Currency

Cuba operates as a dual currency system. Cuban convertible peso (CUC\$) is the currency which you will exchange and use in Cuba. CUC\$ come in the following denominations: 1, 3, 5, 10, 20, 50, and 100. Please note that CUC\$ 1 comes in both a coin and paper money configuration. There is a second currency, the Cuban peso, also called moneda nacional or CUP which is used only by Cuban citizens.

Can I exchange money in Cuba?

Yes. Once in Cuba, the port, tourist hotels, banks, and CADECA bureaus (Cuban government exchange bureaus) can exchange currency (U.S. and Canadian dollars, Euros, British pounds, etc.) for a fee. Non-U.S. currencies such as Euros and Canadian dollars usually have a more favorable exchange rate than the U.S. dollar. Be sure to have proper ID (passport) on hand. Do not accept offers to exchange currency with anyone who approaches you on the street. This is particularly applicable due to the dual currency system used in Cuba.

The U.S. State Department advises that the export of CUCs is strictly prohibited, regardless of the amount

Can I use my credit cards in Cuba?

While U.S. citizens are allowed to use debit and credit cards in Cuba, the vast majority of U.S. banks are still considering whether to allow for these transactions to take place. Thus, it is advisable to assume that all transactions in Cuba will be done using cash.

Will there be Wi-Fi while in Cuba?

All vessels docked in Cuba will provide Wi-Fi service; however, service may not be guaranteed at all times. Cuba has limited Wi-Fi services, although certain hotels and internet cafes may provide service for a fee.

Will I have cellular service while in Cuba?

Several carriers in the U.S. and abroad have signed roaming agreements with Cuban telecommunications firm ETECSA, which allows for voice, data and text services while in Cuba. Please check with your cellular provider for details.

What am I allowed to bring back from Cuba? Can I bring back cigars, rum and other items from Cuba?

U.S. persons are allowed to return with certain Cuban-origin items, including cigars and rum, for personal use only and pursuant to OFAC regulations. These items remain subject to the normal limits on duty and tax exemptions for merchandise imported as accompanied baggage and for personal use. We refer you to the link in the FAQ "Is it legal for U.S. citizens to travel to Cuba?" on page 26 which provides guidance on items that can be imported from Cuba.

How much can I spend while in Cuba?

There are no per diem limits on authorized expenses.

Are excursions included in the cruise fare?

While excursions are not included in the cruise fare, Oceania Cruises will offer a variety of excursions to assist guests in meeting the requirements of people to people exchanges.

How much free time is there?

OFAC requires that individuals traveling under a people-to-people license participate in a full-time schedule of people-to-people exchange activities that result in meaningful interaction between the travelers and individuals in Cuba. As all guests will be self-certifying that their travel complies with the people-to-people license (or one of the other eleven travel categories authorized under general licenses), guests are free to create their own itinerary and to determine what full time constitutes, which may or may not include excursions offered by Oceania Cruises. After completion of people-to-people activities, guests are free to explore as they wish.

Will I be able to move about Cuba freely?

Oceania Cruises will offer a variety of shore excursions in Havana. Guests are not required to participate in these excursions and are free to move about Cuba as long as their activities comply with the general license they are travelling under. Entry to some government buildings may be restricted; it's best to ask your guide about the building's specific entry protocol before trying to enter on your own.

What will the onboard experience be like?

Aside from our luxurious accommodations and enriching onboard experience, including The Finest Cuisine at Sea™, Oceania Cruises will enhance your experience in Cuba with the addition of classes, lectures and other activities focused on Cuba, its culture and its people.

HEALTH & SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS

Is medical insurance required?

All travelers to Cuba must show proof of Cuba approved medical insurance. This medical insurance will be included in the price of your cruise fare.

Does my insurance cover medical expenses while in Cuba?

The provision of health insurance, life insurance and travel insurance related services to authorized U.S. travelers, as well as the receipt of emergency medical services and the making of payments related thereto are authorized by OFAC. However, insurance providers may decide whether or not to participate and provide such coverage in connection with Cuba. It is advisable to check with your insurance provider prior to departure to ensure that you are covered while traveling in Cuba.

Does Medicare cover medical expenses while in Cuba?

It is advisable to check with your Medicare provider prior to departure to ensure that you are covered while traveling in Cuba.

Is there additional travel insurance that I can buy through Oceania Cruises?

Yes. Oceania Cruises will offer additional travel insurance to guests at an additional fee.


Is it safe to travel in Cuba?

Cuba is a safe country where violent crime is rare. As when traveling in any urban area, keep your valuables in sight at all times and be aware of the possibility of petty crime.
