Alaskan Way Viaduct demolition on edge of Pioneer Square this summer

Crews will soon begin removing the southern portion of the Alaskan Way Viaduct, between Yesler Way and South Dearborn Street. Please expect construction and local street closures while crews remove the structure.

What to expect from construction:


- Loudest (impact) work hours are 7 a.m. - 8 p.m. weekdays; 9 a.m. - 8 p.m. Sat; 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. Sun / holiday.
- Cross-streets and area beneath and near viaduct fenced off for safety, with some building and alley restrictions.
- Alaskan Way narrowed to two lanes adjacent to work zone.
- Rubble sorted with machinery and hauled away by trucks.
- Nearby buildings protected with netting and hard barriers. Cranes and saws used in some places where viaduct sits close to nearby buildings.
- Equipment noise, dust, vibration and other typical construction effects.

In late June one crew will begin demolishing the viaduct near South King Street and move south. In July an additional crew will begin removing the structure between Yesler Way and South King Street. Work due to be complete this summer.

WSDOT is removing the seismically vulnerable Alaskan Way Viaduct and making space for an improved Alaskan Way surface street and new public space. The construction work is covered under a permit from the City of Seattle.
