

What is it?

The Diamond Clover program is available for any 4-H youth ages 8-18. Youth do not need to be enrolled 4-H members in order to participate in the Diamond Clover program.

The program consists of six levels that requires youths to plan and report a broad range of age-appropriate accomplishments. For each level, the Nebraska 4-H Diamond Clover program provides a list of accomplishments from which 4-H youth choose their goals. The accomplishments increase in quantity and difficulty for each level. At the beginning of the 4-H year, participants plan what to accomplish and at the end of the 4-H year, they report on their completed accomplishments. Successful completion of a level's Plan & Report form results in a 4-H youth earning that level of the Diamond Clover program.

Diamond Clover Program



The Nebraska 4-H Diamond Clover program encourages 4-H youth to engage in a variety of programs, projects, and activities that will enable them to acquire skills and abilities that will prepare them for success in the future.

Rules

- Youth may only receive recognition at each level once.
- Youth may only receive one level of recognition per year.
- Youth should begin at Level 1 and progress through Level 6.
- While it is encouraged, it is not required that youth complete a 4-H project for each level.
- 4-H youth may begin participation in the Diamond clover program at any time of the year.
- Youth must complete the Plan & Report Form for each level.
- Accomplishments: Each level requires participants to complete a specified number of accomplishments.
 - The 4-H participant may choose accomplishment listed for each level.
 - The accomplishments are age appropriate and increase in quantity and difficulty for each level.

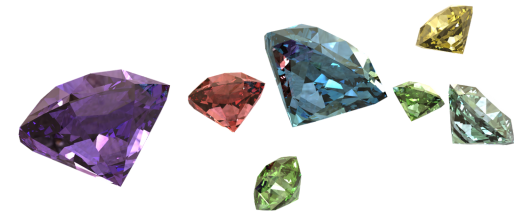


Instructions

1. To begin, the 4-H participant must complete the Plan portion of the Plan & Report Form for the level they are pursuing.
2. A parent/guardian and a 4-H leader will need to confirm the plan.
3. This plan should be saved and used as a point of reference throughout the year.
4. Youth may fill out the Report portion of the form as they complete their accomplishments throughout the year, or at the end of the 4-H year.
5. A parent/guardian and a 4-H leader will need to confirm the report.
6. The completed Plan & Report Form with signatures should be printed and submitted to the local Extension office. **Do not email Plan & Report Forms.**

Recognition

Participants will obtain a certificate of achievement at the end of the 4-H year once they have completed a level. All levels will be awarded with a certificate. Level 6 – Diamond recipients will be presented with a certificate and diamond clover pin.
