Health Rocks! Youth Mentoring Program

The Douglas-Sarpy 4-H program seeks to attract qualified college student candidates who have an interest in human social development, mentoring and/or health sciences to serve as the 4-H Mentor Coordinator for the Health Rocks! 4-H National Mentoring program.

The successful candidate will work directly with the Principal Investigator and the Health Rocks! 4-H Mentoring Program Staff to develop and deliver positive mentoring experiences for youth ages 8-14 using the National 4-H Health Rocks Curriculum as well as managing Peer Mentors (Youth Ages 15-18) who will be actively mentoring their younger peers.

This will be a 14 month paid position (June 2021 to August 2022) working on average 10-15 hours per week before/afterschool with the Peer Mentors and Mentees.

Duties include:

- Manage up to 15 Peer Mentor/Mentee 4-H mentoring groups (15 Mentors, 60 Youth)
- Assist with Peer Mentor Training and Support
- Facilitate teaching of curriculum to Peer Mentors prior to each session
- Support curriculum delivery by working with the PI to purchase needed supplies
- Attend weekly before/after school 4-H mentoring club meeting sessions
- Record attendance of youth participating each week.
- Assist in writing quarterly progress reports
- Maintain financial reports as they relate to purchasing needs and salary.
- Work with community site staff (e.g. Ralston Public Schools) for room and program scheduling.
- Weekly check in meetings with PI.
