Dear Colleagues,

For the first time in Louisiana's history, the Department will recognize and honor early childhood educators and leaders through the Teacher and Leader of the Year Program. Not only is this the first time in Louisiana's history, but it is the first time in the United States for a state Department of Education to specifically honor the incredible professionals who care for our youngest learners. Louisiana has the opportunity to be a national leader in education by honoring our early childhood educators, and every applicant will make history in being a part of the first year of this program.

An early childhood education Teacher or Leader of the Year serves birth-five year old children who are enrolled in a Type III child care center, an Early Head Start or Head Start Center, or in a Family Child Care site participating in the LDOE Family Child Care (FCC) Pilot. Pre-K teachers in traditional school settings should apply through the PreK-12 application, the materials for which can also be found on the [Awards page](#) of the Louisiana Believes website, along with the Early Childhood materials.

Any teacher or leader in the settings described above is invited to apply. There is no formal nomination process this year, but the application process does require recommendations from fellow teachers, site leaders or directors, lead agency employees, parents, colleagues, and/or community members. If you know an outstanding teacher or leader, please check back for updates on how to support these excellent early childhood educators in the application process.

UPDATES FOR TEACHING AND LEARNING

NEW: Renew Your Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate (ECAC) to Continue Eligibility for School Readiness Tax Credits (SRTCs)

Teachers and/or directors with Early Childhood Ancillary Certificates (ECACs) that expire in October 2021 should submit renewal or initial application through [Teach LA Live!](#) as soon as possible. Allow 4-5 weeks processing time for each submission. Teachers and/or directors should receive the certificate or further feedback by November 12, 2021. .

For teachers and/or directors with an ECAC that expires in November 2021, please submit renewal or initial application through [Teach LA Live!](#) no later than October 15. Allow 4-5 weeks processing time for each submission. Teachers and/or directors should receive the certificate or further feedback by November 19, 2021.

Once an application is submitted, please check email regularly for replies from the Department. Those who submit can also verify application submission and check for any new messages using the “History” option on [Teach LA Live!](#).

Once an application is processed, additional feedback is provided or the certificate is issued. Case feedback is usually provided via email with instructions on how to correct the application. Certificate information can be reviewed on [TeachLouisiana.net](#). On the right side, choose “Verify a Certificate” or “Teaching Authorization.”

Any questions regarding the processing of an application should be submitted using [Ask a Question](#) within the [Teach LA Live!](#) Portal.

REMINDER: 2021-2022 Early Childhood Teacher and Leader of the Year

This year, for the first time, the Department will recognize and honor Early Childhood Teachers and Leaders of the Year, in step with their PreK-12 counterparts. NEW: 2021-2022 GOLD® Update

In Louisiana's publicly-funded early childhood classrooms, GOLD® by Teaching Strategies® is used to measure each child's growth and development for multiple purposes. The Department has updated the Teaching Strategies GOLD® license to include both Early Childhood and the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) within one new license for 2021-2022.

Access to the previous GOLD® license closed on August 31, 2021. All documentation for 2021-2022 should be entered into the new license. The previous license will be open for 48 hours on Monday, October 18, to allow teachers to gather any necessary documentation and reporting that was entered into the old license,

NEW: Developmental Screening Initiative

In an effort to support communities and school systems in utilizing universal screenings to identify children in need of intervention, the Department has launched a developmental screening initiative. By Fall 2025, the community network expectation for developmental screenings will be that, at minimum, all publicly-funded children will be screened upon school system enrollment.

Currently the Department is creating appropriate next steps to collect data and analyze the present landscape of screening, referral, and intervention supports among networks. This collaborative effort will aid in appropriately organizing the coordination of supports, resources, and partnerships to assist the field.

There are many valuable resources surrounding this initiative. For example, the [Developmental Screening Guidebook](#) serves as a reference guide to support healthy growth and development of children. The resources within this Guide are intended to deepen the understanding of how children develop, regardless of the child's individual needs, and establish a comprehensive early identification system. The [Early Childhood Transition Process](#) guide provides information to support families in understanding the special education process, make informed decisions for their child, and prepare for smooth and effective

transitions at key entry points. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention [Learn the Signs. Act Early](#) has a host of publications, guidance for concerned families, tools to track child development, and other materials.

UPDATES FOR FUNDING AND ENROLLMENT

NEW: CCAP Family Redetermination Extension

To ensure families continue to receive CCAP services, in light of the COVID-19 pandemic and Hurricane Ida, redetermination cases have been extended for a three month period:

- September cases have been extended to December 31, 2021
- October cases have been extended to January 31, 2022
- November cases have been extended to February 28, 2022

NEW: LA 4 Payments

For the period of August 1, 2021, through October 31, 2021, school systems will receive LA 4 payments equal to the school system allocation as approved in spring 2021. All systems will continue to report actual enrollment and attendance, as in the past; however, payments will be based on the original allocation amount. Beginning in November 2021, a shift will be made so that school systems will be paid based on actual enrollment (including students enrolled in virtual pre-K). Due to funding constraints, school systems are not guaranteed payment for students enrolled in excess of their allocation. August 2021 payments were released on October 11, 2021, and September 2021 payments are pending.

NEW: NSECD Payments

For the period August 1, 2021, through October 31, 2021, sites will receive NSECD payments equal to the site allocation as approved in spring 2021. All sites will continue to report actual enrollment and attendance, as in the past; however, payments will be based on the original allocation amount. Beginning in November 2021, a shift will be made so that sites will be paid based on actual enrollment (including students enrolled in virtual pre-K). Due to funding constraints, sites are not guaranteed payment for students enrolled in excess of their allocation. August 2021 payments were released on September 29, 2021, and September 2021 payments are pending.

REMINDER: LaCAP Grant Survey for Providers

Child care providers that received LaCAP grants are required to complete a survey from Postlethwaite and Netterville (P&N).

Participation in the survey is mandatory. Failure to complete the survey will impact future grant opportunities. Additional penalties include CCAP payment suspension and participation in an audit of the

LaCAP Grants by P&N.

REMINDER: ARPA Stabilization Grants - Flexibility Due to Hurricane Ida

On August 5, the Department released the ARPA Stabilization Grant Round 1 application to all qualified child care providers (including Type I, II, & III licensed child care centers, as well as CCAP-certified in-home and family child care providers). The deadline to submit this application was August 19.

Previously, child care providers were required to be open by September 1, 2021, to receive the ARPA Stabilization Grant. Due to the impact of Hurricane Ida in our state, those centers that applied timely but were closed on September 1, 2021, will still qualify for the ARPA grant.

ARPA grant fund disbursements began regionally the week of September 14.

UPDATES FOR LICENSED CENTERS, FAMILY CHILD CARE, AND IN-HOME PROVIDERS

NEW: CPR/Pediatric First Aid (PFA) Trainers

The Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE) Division of Licensing is assisting licensed child care and in-home providers with obtaining CPR and PFA certification for early childhood staff. The CPR/PFA provider will be authorized to be paid a rate up to \$65 per licensed child care staff member or registered and certified in-home provider. If a CPR/PFA provider has not submitted a quote requesting to be added to the LDOE Division of Licensing's roster, the CPR/PFA provider will be unable to receive payment.

Please note: under no circumstance can a trainer, who is a director or owner of a center, be paid for training the staff employed at their center.

Instructions to become eligible as a LDOE CPR/PFA provider:

- Verify you are a registered vendor with the State of Louisiana and have a LaGov vendor number. (<https://wwwcfprd.doa.louisiana.gov/OSP/LaPAC/vendor/srchven2.cfm>)
 - If not registered as a vendor, register prior to entering the LaGov PO. (link to instructions: <https://www.doa.la.gov/media/gewlb4nk/lagov-vendorregistration.pdf>)
- Submit an Initial Proposal (quote) to the Louisiana Department of Education, Division of Licensing to Idelicensing@la.gov.
- The quote should include at a minimum the vendor number, a description of the training, the names of participants, and total dollar amount for training.
- Once the official quote is approved, a detailed statement will be required for each payment. The

detailed statement should include:

- Vender Number
- Description of the training
- Names of the participants (Center Name, Address, Director's Name, and Phone Number)
- Invoice Number
- Quantity for the training (number of individuals to whom this vendor will be providing services. Up to 300 center staff can be trained at a rate of up to \$65 per staff.)
- Total dollar amount
- Accepted method of payment (P-card payment-credit card or check)
- Ensure you are able to provide a live demonstration and receive a live demonstration from the early childhood center staff.

NEW: Extension of Fence Waivers due Hurricane Ida

On September 17, 2021, a Request for A Waiver from the Child Care Licensing Standards 1903. E Outdoor Space was provided to centers in the declared disaster parishes to allow temporary operation without an outdoor space that is fully enclosed with a permanent fence or other permanent barrier if the fence or barrier was damaged by Hurricane Ida. The permanent fence or other permanent barrier must be replaced or repaired by October 15, 2021. If you are unable to have the permanent fence or barrier replaced or repaired by October 15, 2021, please resend the waiver request submitted with the following information:

- Date of scheduled repair and projected completion date
- Receipt or invoice showing materials purchased

NEW: Well-Ahead Grant Opportunity

Together, Well-Ahead Louisiana and the Department are offering the "Let's Be Healthy" grant to support child care centers in implementing farm to early care education (Farm to ECE) practices. Farm to ECE focuses on educating child care providers on strategies and activities to increase access to healthy local foods through procurement, gardening, nutrition, and agriculture education.

The first 16 applicants that meet all eligibility requirements will receive \$1,700 in funding and technical assistance to implement Farm to ECE practices.

UPDATES FOR DIRECTORS

NEW: Director Levels for School Readiness Tax Credits (SRTCs)

The Department is sending email notifications of star rating and levels to eligible directors by October 15, 2021. Director and staff member tax forms will be mailed by January 2022.

For re-leveling with Louisiana Pathways Career ladders, new credentials and certifications should be submitted before December 31, 2021, to Louisiana Pathways. Parent School Readiness Tax Credit forms will be mailed to Type III centers by December 2021.

NEW: Child Care Management Software Initiative (CCMSi)

The Department is working to increase automation in early learning centers, to streamline time and attendance tracking and other operations, eventually connecting to the state's Edlink database. Eight Department-approved CCMS vendors have been selected to be included in the CCMS Guidebook. This guidebook will be released later this month. Type III child care centers and CCAP-certified family child care providers will be eligible to participate in the initiative, where they can purchase an annual CCMS subscription with an 80% reimbursement for a maximum of \$1,000.

REMINDER: Tax Consultation

The LDOE has contracted with [JW Royston, E.A. and Associates, Inc.](#) to provide up to two hours of tax consultation to a limited number of Type III providers, to better understand each provider's current tax situations and needs. All Type III (for-profit and nonprofit) early learning centers are eligible to participate in this opportunity.

Consultation began September 1, 2021, and will be available until June 30, 2022 (or until contract hours have been expended). Type III providers interested in this consultation can begin the process by completing this [interest form](#).

REMINDER: Advanced Level Business Training

The LDOE has contracted with [First Children's Finance](#) (FCF) to develop and implement a series of business supports for Type III early learning centers in Louisiana, to further enhance the capacity of early learning center owners in Louisiana to build and strengthen internal systems of monitoring, evaluation, and compliance.

Training topics include finance, managing enrollment, partnerships, human resources, marketing and communication, systems compliance, policies and business practices, program planning and evaluation, facility management, and professional staff development/pedagogical leadership.

Additionally, the topics of business efficiency initiatives, specifically Child Care Management Software (CCMS) and automation, will be one of the areas of focus for at least one session.
