Notice is hereby given that pursuant to the authority set forth below, the Georgia Government Transparency and Campaign Finance Commission (hereinafter "Commission") proposes to adopt:

Advisory Opinion No. 2017-01

Lengthy statements or statements of a considerable technical or economic nature, as well as previously recorded messages, must be submitted for the official record. Oral statements should be concise and will be limited to five (5) minutes per person. Written comments are welcome. Such written comments must be legible and signed, and should contain contact information from the maker (address, telephone and/or facsimile number, etc.). To ensure their consideration, written comments must be received on or before June 13, 2017. GEORGIA GOVERNMENT TRANSPARENCY & CAMPAIGN FINANCE COMMISSION

Advisory Opinion No. 2017-01

In response to numerous informal requests to Commission staff, the Georgia Government Transparency and Campaign Finance Commission advises that the Campaign Finance Act requires elected public officers and candidates for public office to maintain their accounting records for an "election cycle" rather than a fiscal or calendar year accounting period. Under the Act an "election cycle" ends on the day of an election (including a run-off, if any), and a new "election cycle" begins the following day. Thus, elected public officers and candidates for public office must reset their respective campaign contribution and campaign expenditure balances as of the date an "election cycle" begins, including resetting their "total contributions previously reported," "total expenditures made and reported prior to this reporting period," and "net balance on hand," and these reset balances are reported on the first report due after the "election cycle" begins (usually the December 31 CCDR).

Questions Presented

- (1) What accounting period does the Campaign Finance Act or Commission mandate for use by public officers and candidates for public office as it relates to the filing of campaign contribution disclosure reports (hereinafter "CCDR")?
- (2) When must public officers and candidates for public office reset their campaign account balances on their CCDRs?
- (3) What balances are reset on a public officer's and candidate's CCDR?

Factual Background

After receiving numerous inquiries from state, county and municipal public officers and candidates for public office, Commission staff seek guidance as to what accounting periods and principals are to be used by public officers and candidates for public office on CCDRs filed with the Commission and local filing officer. Commission staff also seek guidance as to what balances elected public officers¹ and candidates for public office must reset to zero or another value at the conclusion of a designated accounting period.

¹ A public officer is defined as every constitutional officer, every elected state official, the executive head of every state department or agency, whether elected or appointed, each member of the General Assembly, the executive

Discussion

The Campaign Finance Act, O.C.G.A. § 21-5-1, et. seq., requires every elected public officer and candidate for public office to file periodic campaign finance disclosures and personal financial statements with the Commission in the form of campaign contribution disclosure reports and personal financial disclosure statements respectively. See O.C.G.A. §§ 21-5-2, 21-5-34(a)(1)(A), and 21-5-50(a)(1). While state level public officers and candidates for public office are required to electronically file their periodic campaign finance and personal financial disclosures directly with the Commission, local public officers and candidates for local public office are required to file their disclosures with a local government agency which then serves as the officer's/candidate's proxy by transmitting those disclosures to the Commission. O.C.G.A. §§ 21-5-34(a)(1)(B)(3)-(4) and 21-5-50(a)(3)-(3.1).

To further the goal of promoting transparency in campaign finance disclosures the Act imposes, in addition to a regular filing regimen, a method of accounting that is substantially different from the generally accepted accounting principles ("GAAP") utilized by private and government entities.² A major difference between GAAP and accounting principles under the CFA is that public officers and candidates for public office must report their respective cumulative totals for campaign contributions and campaign expenditures based on an entire "election cycle" (which can last several years) as opposed to a calendar or fiscal year. *See, e.g.,* O.C.G.A. § 21-5-34(b)(1)(D) ("Total contributions received and total expenditures shall be reported for an election cycle ...").

An "election cycle" is statutorily defined as "the period from the day following the date of an election or appointment of a person to elective public office through and including the date of the next such election of a person to the same public office and shall be construed and applied separately for each elective office." O.C.G.A. § 21-5-3(10). The defined period for an "election cycle" does not align in most (if not all) instances with either a calendar year or a fiscal year.

Thus, based on the statutory definition of "election cycle" and the requirement that reporting be done on the basis of the "election cycle," an elected public officer's or candidate's campaign should reset its accounting balances on the first report following the general election for the office they are seeking (or the general election that occurs for the office that they sought, irrespective of said individual's qualification for office or advancement from the primary election to general election for said office). If the election leads to a run-off, the election cycle does not end until the run-off is held since the run-off is a continuation of the general election. O.C.G.A. § 21-5-3(10).

director of each state board, commission, council, or authority and the members thereof, every elected county official and every elected member of a local board of education, every elected municipal official, the members of the State Transportation Board and any public officer or employee who has any discretionary authority over, or is a member of a public body which has discretionary authority over, the selection of a vendor to supply any goods or services to an state agency. O.C.G.A. §§ 21-5-3(22)(A)-(G) and 21-5-70(6).

² Generally accepted accounting principles are determined by the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") and the Government Accounting Standards Board ("GASB") for private and government entities respectively. See generally, Financial Accounting Foundation, *Generally Accepted Accounting Principles*, (May 1, 2017, 10:30 AM), https://www.financialaccountingfoundation.org/gaap.

In the instance where an elected public officer or candidate for public office will not be running again for the office and has begun winding down their campaign after the filing of their final report in an election year (e.g., the December 31 CCDR), so as to dispose of their remaining campaign contributions and terminate their campaign, the campaign should not reset its balances and should continue reporting its cumulative campaign contributions and campaign expenditures until the "net balance on hand" reaches zero. O.C.G.A. §§ 21-5-3(10) and 21-5-34(b)(1)(D).

After the conclusion of an election cycle, all public officers and candidates for public office should reset the following balances on their next CCDR (usually the December 31 CCDR). O.C.G.A. §§ 21-5-3(10) and 21-5-34(b)(1)(D). Pursuant to Georgia's CFA, the following balances must be reset as detailed below at the close of an election cycle:

- 1) The "Total contributions previously reported" (Line 2 of the standard CCDR) is the "Net Balance on Hand" (Line 15 of the standard CCDR) from the preceding Report. O.C.G.A. § 21-5-34(b)(1)(D)(i), See also, O.C.G.A. § 21-5-34(b)(1)(D)(v) and Exhibits A and B.
- 2) The "Total expenditures made and reported prior to this reporting period" (Line 8 of the standard CCDR) is reset to zero. O.C.G.A. § 21-5-34(b)(1)(D)(iii), See also, Exhibits A and B.
- 3) The "Net Balance on Hand" (Line 15 of the standard CCDR) should reflect the sum total of Lines 6 and 12 of the current CCDR. O.C.G.A. § 21-5-34(b)(1)(D)(i)-(v), See also, Exhibits A and B.

Conclusion

For the reasons described above, the Commission advises that the Campaign Finance Act requires elected public officers and candidates for public office to maintain their accounting records for an "election cycle" rather than a fiscal or calendar year accounting period. Under the Act an "election cycle" ends on the day of an election (including a run-off, if any), and a new "election cycle" begins the following day. Thus, elected public officers and candidates for public office must reset their respective campaign contribution and campaign expenditure balances as of the date an "election cycle" begins, including resetting their "total contributions previously reported," "total expenditures made and reported prior to this reporting period," and "net balance on hand," and these reset balances are reported on the first report due after the "election cycle" begins (usually the December 31 CCDR).

Advisory Opinion 2017-01 is hereby adopted by the Commission in conformity with O.C.G.A. § 21-5-6(13) on **June 14, 2017**.
