- *<u>U.S. House Appropriations Committee budget</u>, approved Sept. 11, 2025, <u>cuts</u> LSC funding by 46%.

 <u>U.S. Senate Appropriations Committee budget</u>, approved July 2025, <u>increases</u> LSC funding by \$6 million.

 <u>White House budget</u>, proposed May 2025, <u>eliminates LSC</u>.

- 7 legal aid organizations in PA, including LASP, receive federal funding from LSC. All 67 counties in Pennsylvania are served by legal aid organizations.
