Claire Harwell, J.D. - *Community Justice Project Director*

Claire Harwell joined the staff of the Coalition in 2010 to manage the Coalition's Community Justice Project, a statewide, specialized non-profit, civil legal practice located at eight sites, exclusively serving sexual assault survivors and rape crisis centers. Claire has worked in the field of sexual assault prevention and intervention for over three decades, serving as a victim advocate, trainer, police officer, prosecutor, and currently as a civil attorney. In addition to New Mexico, she has been a victim advocate and prevention expert with rape crisis centers in North Carolina, Pennsylvania and Virginia. As a consultant, she has advised universities, the U.S. military, prosecutors' offices and the U.S. Department of Justice on matters relating to effective response to crimes of sexual violence and frequently serves as a local and national trainer on these topics. Claire received her BA from the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill and her J.D. from the University of New Mexico School of Law.

Currently, Claire provides multi-disciplinary professional training, technical assistance, legal guidance documents, internal legal counsel, and legal education for anti-violence programs and survivors.

Cole graduated with a B.A. in Comparative Languages & Linguistics from Earlham College, where he was also involved as a Sexual Assault Peer Advocate. Following these studies, Cole taught English abroad before moving to New Mexico and beginning to work for the Rape Crisis Center of Central New Mexico as both a victim advocate and volunteer program manager. In 2016, Cole also joined the New Mexico DV/SA Network for state, tribal, and local groups coordinating to strengthen collective responses to interpersonal violence. Cole has been with the University of New Mexico's LoboRESPECT Advocacy Center since September 2016, where he develops, coordinates, and provides prevention education programming around sexual violence, healthy relationships, active listening, bystander intervention, and other topics across UNM undergraduate, graduate, health sciences, and law programs. Cole additionally provides Title-IX related and general advocacy to students at UNM.
