The Hillsborough Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) has an opening on its Citizens Advisory Committee for an at-large member representing the business community.

The MPO is a long-range transportation policy-making board made up of local government and transportation agency representatives planning for more than \$1.5 billion in state and federally funded multi-modal transportation investments in the next 5 years. The MPO is responsible for developing a 20+ year metropolitan transportation plan. More information is available at http://www.planhillsborough.org/metropolitan-planning-organization-mpo/.

The Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) is composed of appointed citizens (transportation agency staff and MPO consultants are not eligible) who represent a broad spectrum of social and economic backgrounds and who have an interest in the development of an efficient, safe and cost-effective transportation system. It is responsible for providing information and overall community values and needs to transportation planners and the MPO Board; evaluating and proposing solutions from a citizen's perspective concerning alternative transportation proposals and critical issues; providing knowledge gained through the CAC to local citizen and business groups; and establishing comprehension and promoting credibility for the MPO Program.

CAC members must reside in Hillsborough County and serve a two-year term, with an opportunity for reappointment thereafter. Members are expected to attend monthly CAC meetings that occur at 9 AM on the second or third Wednesday of the month.
